THE SUGAR BEET IS

Very Difficult to Cultivate Says Prof. Shutt.

FARM WATER SUPPLY

Samples Sent to the Laboratory Will be Examined Free.

(Ottawa Free Press 32nd.) Professor Frank T. Shutt, of the Chemical Laboratory, has again resumed his duties after a month's vacation spent in New York State. While there he says he was surprised and pleased to find the farmers so familiar with the reports of the Central Experimental Farm. Some were better acquainted with the work carried on at this institution than at their own experimental farms at Geneva or Ithaca.

The provincial government of Manitoba is anxious that a beet containing a large percentage of sugar be cultivated, and if such can be found practical, they will probably subsidize the industry. The superintendents of the Experimental farms at Brandon and Indian Head have sent samples to be tested as to their sugar bearing qualities. From Brandon the Red Top, New Danish, Improved, Danish Improved, Vilmorin's Improved, Improved Imperial, Wanzlaben and the same varieties, together with the Danish Red Top from Brandon. Before analysis the beets are all weighed to find the average. The leaves, crown and point of each beet is cut off and only the centre submitted for examination. This is sliced and reduced to pulp after which the juice, which is of brownish color, owing to the presence of the sugar, is pressed out, and the sugar contents ascertained. Owing to the past season being an abnormal one, Professor Shutt thinks that nothing definite can be concluded from the present analysis of sugar beets. The sugar beet is very difficult to cultivate.

Another lot of pigs were slaughtered today in order to proceed with the examinations of the pork, and it is expected that a data which will explain the best methods of feeding will be in possession of the chemists in about three weeks. Quite recently a sample of cocoa-nut cake was received from Trinidad for the purpose of ascertaining its feeding properties. Products of a similar nature are already cultivated to good advantage in Canada, and it is expected that this will prove a good feed and also one capable of cultivation.

An article appeared in the Farmer's Advocate some time ago referring to qualities of water and the means of having them tested. People were instructed to send samples to the Central Experimental Farm. In connection with the matter the following letter was sent to the paper by Professor Shutt:

"It is with much pleasure that I noticed the timely warning and the good advice regarding the farm water supply contained in your last issue. The question is one of the greatest importance, and merits much more consideration than it at present receives in many of our rural districts.

You refer to the fact that people suspicious of the purity of their supply and desiring an analysis may forward a supply to the Chemical Laboratory of the Experimental Farm, Ottawa, and that the examination will be made gratis. This is quite correct, but may I be allowed to point out to your readers that there are certain directions it is essential should be carried out in the collection and shipment of the water sample, and that a copy of those directions will be forwarded to farmers and dairymen on application. I write this note because it frequently happens that the samples received by us are insufficient in quantity or have been put in bottles not chemically clean, or that dirty or previously used corks are employed, and consequently the samples are worthless for the purposes of an analysis."
