

LUMBER PRICES LIKELY TO SOAR

WINNIPEG, Man., March 22.—There is every indication today of a big increase in prices of lumber and lumber products in the very near future in western Canada.

In the face of prosperity in every line of trade and an increasing demand, it is charged here that the

manufacturers of lumber, shingles and other wood products, are deliberately curtailing their output. In this way the market is being starved and decidedly higher prices are being created.

While it is announced that the British Columbia mills found it a practical financial necessity to curtail the log cut, at the same time the Pacific coast export trade is increasing, the railroad companies are continuing construction and the demand for lumber and shingles in the prairie provinces is growing.

—Hubert McDonald, Wilnot, is doing a big business sawing wood with his gasoline engine. He is now engaged sawing a large pile for James Murphy.

—Capt. F. W. Peters, Summerside, left yesterday afternoon for Halifax and other places on the south shore of Nova Scotia where he will look up a schooner suitable for the coasting trade.

—Mrs. Allen Hudson, who has been visiting her mother, Mrs. R. McC. Staver, Summerside has left for her home in Brocton, Mass. Her brother, E. T. Staver, accompanied her as far as Pictou.

—The following are the Alberton market prices:—White oats forty cents, black oats forty five cents, butter eighteen cents, eggs sixteen cents, pork eight cents and loose hay eight dollars to nine.

—Dealers in Summerside, yesterday were paying from sixteen to eighteen cents per lb for butter, fifteen cents per dozen for eggs, eight dollars per ten for loose hay, four dollars and fifty cents for straw, forty-eight cents for white oats and fifty cents for black, seven and three quarters to eight and a half cents per lb for pork ten cents per lb for chickens and ducks, 15 cents per lb for turkey and eight cents per lb for fowl.

—As a result of the snow storm of Monday night which seems to have been very heavy in the western part of the Province. The morning train from the west, due in Summerside at nine o'clock, did not arrive until two thirty p.m. yesterday, having had considerable trouble with the snow between Alberton and O'Leary. Owing to this delay the Cape Traverse train was ordered into Summerside to take the place of the delayed train and left Summerside for Charlottetown at the regular hour.

—Bennet Scribner of Moncton, who has lately taken a position in the Drugstore of P. N. Enman, Summerside met with a painful accident yesterday afternoon. While working on the second floor of Enman's Drugstore he accidentally fell through the elevator shaft to the ground floor a distance of about fifteen feet. The fall resulted in the dislocating of one of his wrists, and badly injuring the other one and one of his knees, besides several bruises on his face. After having the wounds dressed he was taken to his boarding house and last night was resting easily although suffering considerable pain.

THE HALIFAX BUDGET.

HALIFAX, March 23.—Premier Murray has presented the Provincial budget. The total revenue was \$1,783,467, the largest in the history of the Province. The chief items apart from the Federal subsidy were: Fines, \$632,016; successive duties, \$79,045; Crown Lands, \$30,861. The increase in revenue over the preceding year was \$345,300, and but for the steel coal dispute, which unsettled industrial operations, it would have been much larger. The Premier forecasted that within a short time the Government would receive at least a million dollars from Coal and Royalties alone. The expenditure was \$1,624,759, leaving a surplus of \$158,708. Road appropriations amounting to \$72,117 were unpaid at the end of the fiscal year, leaving an actual balance of \$86,000.
