CONDITIONS OF BIBLE STUDY CONTEST

1. Persons may join the club at any time during the year, but must, of course answer the 52 questions to qualify for the prizes. It is however desirable that the questions be answered as the lessons are studied.
2. Each contestant, or his or her family, must be a subscriber to The Guardian, during the continuance of the contest, in order to qualify for membership in the International Newspaper Bible Study Club and this Local Club.
3. Each contestant in this Local Club, must answer each of the written questions, for 52 consecutive weeks, commencing on Sunday, Aug. 23rd, 1908, and the answers must all be in the possession of The Guardian within two weeks of the close of this period, which allows two weeks grace after the close of the contest.
4. Each question must be answered separately, and the paper written on one side only. No answer must exceed two hundred words in length and may be less. It will be a convenience if students will write their answers on letter paper, about 8 1/2 inches by 11 inches.
5. Each answer must have the name and address of the writer at the bottom of the answer, so it can be located, given a number registered, and the name cut off so the examiner may know it by number only.
6. Students should be careful to understand the question before answering. To do this, the lesson text must be read and especially the verse, or verses, upon which the question is based.
7. The answers from this Local Club must be delivered to this office, and they will be collected at the close of the contest, and forwarded to headquarters for independent examination by competent examiners. The prizes will then be awarded according to the highest number of marks, won by members of The International Newspaper Bible Study Club, and prizes which may be awarded to members of this Local Club will be given out from this office.

MANY RUSSIANS FORM NEW LOVE LEAGUES

Pervading All Classes--Literary and Scientific Discussion Pretexts For Orgies.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 27—The free love movement among the youth of Russia seems to be growing rapidly and to be extending its influence among all classes of the population. One reliable report states that men and women from thirteen to sixty years of age are joining the free love and kindred societies in swarms, and not only are they not ashamed of such affiliation, but they take every available opportunity of glorifying in it. The northern and central provinces are these most tainted, and from them come the worst accounts; the south and east are not so bad. In the report mentioned above it is stated that in the town of Minsk there is a large association of students of both sexes which meets every evening in variously appointed homes. Ostensibly these meetings are for the purpose of discussing literary and scientific subjects, but this avowed object is only a cloak for immoral revels. It is a rule of the allowance that each member shall bring to the meeting a small candle and, as long as the candles continue to burn the debate on science or literature keeps up, but soon the last candle is consumed, leaving the room in darkness. Young boys and girls attend these meetings in Minsk, and that is but one of several towns where such societies exist and similar scenes are enacted.

In St. Petersburg there exists the well known "Red Saloon," which the police have tried in vain to suppress. There many young girls, most of them of excellent parentage, meet men well known in the gay life of the capital. The place is completely furnished and hung with scarlet, the servants wear red livery and the women don red costumes when they arrive. The meetings take place late in the evening. Politics, art, the theatre, literature and kindred subjects are discussed. In the midst of the discussion a servant appears and announces that in fifteen minutes the electric lights will be turned off. The discussion keeps on as though nothing had occurred. Then the lights go out at the appointed time, and the mixed company remain in the dark for some time, when the voice of the servant is heard announcing that in another fifteen minutes the lights will be again turned on. The "Red Saloon" has certain rules and regulations which are binding upon those who attend the meetings there, and they are all bound to secrecy. All the "love leagues" are run on about the same plan as these, but in some of the most exclusive the members must be persons who have passed high examinations at one of the universities or technical schools. All these leagues are wholly independent of the "Slavny" movement. The Slavniks call themselves a theosophical and pretend to be followers of a new and reformed philosophic movement, but these other societies have still more flimsy pretexts for existence.
