THE SESSION ENDED.

The session of the Legislature which closed yesterday has been an important and eventful one. The provisions made toward securing the Hillsborough bridge, an extension of the Lunatic Hospital and the erection of a new College building may be commended as necessary and progressive measures.

But the session will be memorable for bad measures as well as good ones, and notorious among the former is the legislation by which the system of liquor licenses has been restored to the statute book. And for that measure the Liberal party is distinctly and solely responsible.

Five of the ministerial party were absent from the final test vote on the third reading of the license bill, so that it was carried by the narrow majority of one vote. The absent five were Hon Messrs Sinclair and McLaughlin, and Messrs. D. A. McKinnon, Wise and McWilliams.

As the Examiner states, Premier Peters was not a temperance man, but he dared not propose a license law. Premier Warburton, himself a believer in the license system, withdrew a bill that he had prepared to that end, because of the strength of the opposition from the temperance community.

The consequences must be far-reaching. The temperance men and prohibitionists of P. E. Island have had much to bear of late, but this betrayal of their hopes by "their own familiar friends in whom they trusted" and with whom they had so often taken counsel is the severest blow of all.

It will be seen that the Provincial Government have offered a reward of \$100 for information that will lead to the conviction of the dastardly miscreant who fired Mr. Stewart's summer cottage at Lewis Point.
