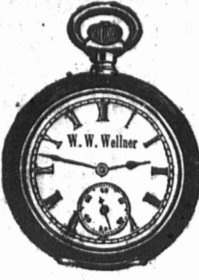

ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

THERE was excellent crossing at the Capes yesterday the ice boats reaching Cape Traverse in three hours and a half. The mails reached the City at two fifteen. The Stanley made an effort to reach Pictou but was compelled to return to Georgetown.

THE Knights of Columbus have given \$1,000 to His Grace Mgr. Bruchet towards liquidating the debt on the Hospital for incurables at Notre Dame de Grace, an institution in which Monsignor is taking an especial interest. The presentation took place upon the occasion of the Archbishop's first visit to the Knights' headquarters at the corner of Sherbrooke street and Park avenue. When His Grace entered the parlors he was met by 150 members in full dress, and comprising the leading English-speaking Catholics of Montreal, and a good representation of French Canadian members. The presentation was made by Mr. Justice Doherty, grand knight of the Canada Council, and Mr. Joseph Mercier, grand knight of the Dominion Council. The addresses were in English and French. His grace replied in a happy manner, expressing his appreciation of all that he had seen, and heard since entering their precincts. He extolled the Catholic principles of the Knights, thanked them for their Christian generosity, and gave the episcopal blessing.—Montreal Star.

Despite the severity of the weather and the unfavorable condition of the roads quite a large number of people assembled to say a last sad farewell to all that was earthly of Mary Eliza, beloved wife of Edward McKay of Darnley, who departed this life on Monday Feb. 14th at the early age of 91 years. Deceased bore her illness of almost a year's standing with that calmness and patience only found in those whose "life is hid with Christ in God," laying it down at the last in the full assurance of receiving at the hands of a forgiving Saviour "the crown of life that fadeeth not away." Being of a quiet and unassuming disposition she naturally won the respect and esteem of all those with whom she came in contact. It could be truly said of her that she possessed the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit which is in the sight of God of great price. This is the second time during the last seven months that the angel of death has visited this home, the other sad occasion being in July last when John McKay was called away to his eternal reward. The funeral service was conducted by the pastor Rev. E. J. Rattee who spoke comforting words from Matt. 25:21. Besides a sorrowing husband and four small children deceased leaves to mourn a mother, three sisters and two brothers who have the sincere sympathy of all in this their hour of sore bereavement.
