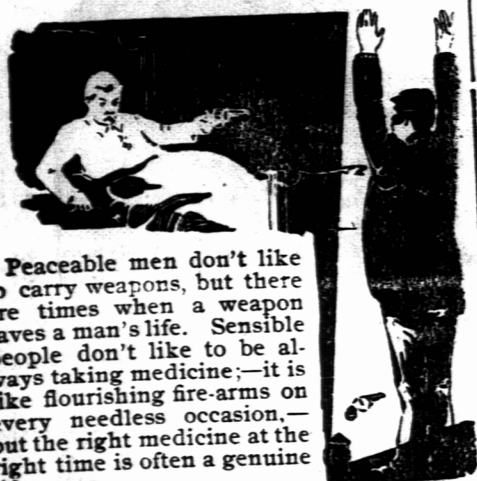

ment as assistant to the Mining Inspector for the Indian Division.

"All the Island boys are well and I believe, are meeting with success. Messrs. Breat Dawson, Alex. McRae and Samuel Nicholson, Point Prim, are on Sulphur Creek.

Messrs. Fred. Kennedy, N. McFarlane, Summerside, W. Woriman and D. Foley are on Dominion Creek.

Messrs. Gordon Dawson, I. B. Lewis, Hamilton Dawson and R. A. FitzSimmons are on Hunker Creek.

"Mr. Peter Ferguson is on the Big Shookum. Messrs. John McLeod, Point Prim, and D. Gouldrupt are on the Bonaniya.

"Mr. D. Farquharson was down from Stewart River last month. The first time we saw him since leaving Vancouver. He is looking fine and reports Stewart City booming and Thistle Creek flourishing.

"A wager was settled here yesterday, and a miner packed 200 lbs of flour on his back, from No. six above Discovery, on Hunker to No. three below Upper Discovery on Dominion, a distance of eight miles, two miles of which are up one side of a divide and about one half mile down the other, which is steep walking. He walked the distance in six hours and ten minutes, losing a \$500 bet by 10 minutes. There are few men in this or any other country who could do it, as the trail was knee-deep in mud, slash and water. It is not likely the experiment will be attempted again.

"It is about forty miles from here to Dawson. The days are nice and warm, we have daylight from five a. m. to nine p. m. and the snow is disappearing very rapidly and the rivers will soon be open. Slaicing will begin on the creek about May 1st.

"Dominion Creek has made a good showing and will probably clean up about \$3,000,000 this spring. The whole Klondyke District will probably clean up about \$15,000,000 and Royalty will be paid on about \$8,000,000."

The output of Klondyke gold for the season of '98-'99 is simply a matter of guesswork. One man has as much right to guess as another and his figures are entitled to the same consideration. Twenty millions of dollars has been suggested as a good guess, but it must not be forgotten that royalty was only paid last year on four millions. The output has not been more than double, so that it is not probable that royalty will this year be paid on more than eight millions of dollars. Exemptions and evasions will give about double that amount as the production of the territory for the year ending in the summer of '99. The primitive methods used in working the claims makes it very unlikely that the washup will give more than from twelve to fifteen millions at the outside.

### S. of T. Resolution.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted by "Refuge" Division S. of T., Fredericton, at its meeting a few evenings ago:

Whereas, The Government of P. E. Island has enacted a License Law by virtue of which the sale of intoxicating liquors becomes a legal business in the City of Charlottetown, in consideration of the payment of two hundred dollars per annum;

And Whereas, such legislation revives the old License System and accrues to the government a large amount of revenue.

And Whereas, we believe such a measure to be contrary to the true temperance sentiment of the Province and feel confident will do absolutely nothing for the suppression of the liquor traffic;

Therefore resolved: that we, the members of "Refuge" Division in weekly session do hereby express most emphatically our disapproval of the action of the Government in deriving a revenue from the sale of intoxicating liquors.

### BRILLIANT ISLANDER.

Mr. W. P. S. Murray Bradalbane, in Bethany College West Va. Receives the Degree of B. A.

We are pleased to learn that at the Commencement at Bethany College recently Mr. W. P. S. Murray of Bradalbane who has just completed a course in Theology received the degree of B. A. from that famous institution. He took first place in many of the subjects for senior year and heads the list of ministerial graduates of 1899. The honorary degree was conferred on him by President W.K. Pendleton D.L. D. who assisted Alexander Campbell to found the college in 1840. Mr. Murray received also a diploma, as an orator, from the Netrophian Literary Society of Bethany College. At the closing exercises he delivered two orations one "The Spirit of Progress" before the U. L. Society and the other "The Power of Mind over Matter" before an assembly of nearly one thousand people. The Wheeling News speaks of him thus:—"The Power of Mind over Matter" was the subject of the oration by Mr. Murray. He is an orator of no mean ability and he handled his subject with much skill and elocutionary force. It was up to the high standard of Mr. Murray's previous effort. He gave an illustration proving his beliefs and cited many conclusive incidents. One hand can chain the lightning and apply it to the useful pursuits of life. It is but the work of a brain to control forces sufficient to shake the entire world. The forces of nature become slaves and servants to the ingenuity of man, weakest among creatures.
