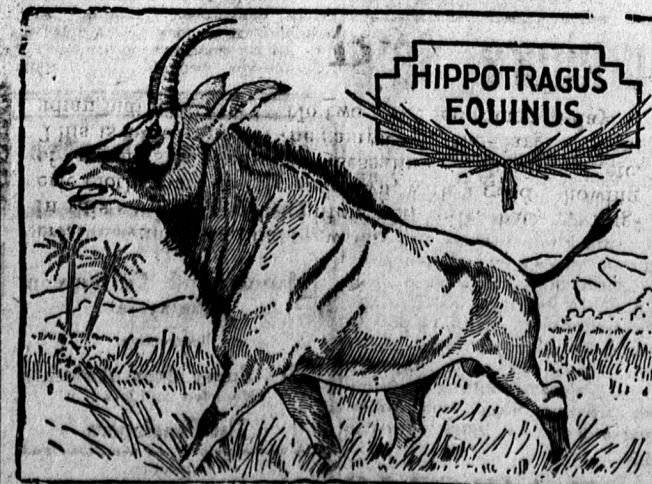

THE STORK BUSY IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, July 22—Three sets of triplets have arrived in Montreal within forty-eight hours. The children of Mrs. Shapiro, two boys and a girl, and those of Mrs. McEachern, two girls and a boy, are doing well. Two of Mrs. Allen's three boys have died, however, and the third is very sick. Mrs. Allen also had twins last August, a boy and a girl. The girl died at the age of three weeks and the boy died last month.

GERMANY'S BIG AIRSHIP.

BERLIN, July 23—The most modern military airship of the Zeppelin system has been taken over by the war department today, after an endurance and speed trial lasting eighteen hours. The airship developed 49 miles an hour, and is considered the most speedy dirigible in the world. It has been christened the "Z III" and is to be stationed at the fortress of Meez near the French frontier.

MAN KILLED IN TORONTO.

TORONTO July 22—With his right arm and the right side of his head terribly crushed, the body of a man supposed to be Ernest Symes, G. T. R. track just west of Simcoe street. How the man came to his death is unknown. None of the train crews working in the yards reported seeing him and it is thought that he was killed by an outgoing freight train. From his position beside the tracks it appears that he was walking north and was struck by a west-bound train. He is a man of about thirty years and dressed in a blue suit of English make. In his pocket was \$5.87 and
