If the son does not have the two sons he will only receive half the amount. He is 26 years of age now, is married, and has one daughter, to whom the grandfather left the sum of "one dollar, Canadian Currency."

BLACK OPAL SOCIAL CRAZE.

The Black Opal, though comparatively a new species, has proven a wonderful boon to the miners of Australia, whence it comes. It is a known fact that while the mines are working day and night trying to supply London, Paris and New York, where the social leaders have decreed that the stone is not alone lucky, but in good form. As a result of the social craze for the new gem, the large jewellers of New York have been unable to secure enough good specimens to keep pace with the demand, and nearly every consignment is sold long before it reaches America.

Opals is found in an amorphous state and never crystallizes; in fact from the condition of the deposits where the mineral is found, the indications are that the substance was once a fluid. This beautiful mineral varies from 5.5 to 6, in hardness, has the specific gravity of 2 to 2.2, is glassy in lustre and translucent from a slight to a very high degree.

Up to 1880 the Czerowitz mines of Hungary were practically the only source from which the gem market received its precious or noble opals. Honduras fire opals and Mexican varieties were occasionally to be had, but these stones were irregular in quality and are not cherished by the social queens.

AN OLD ITALIAN LEGEND.

One often hears the expression, "Round as Giotto's O," but how few people know its origin. It is drawn from a pretty legend, which is given here:

Giotto was a humble shepherd boy, who lived sometime between 1276 and 1336, in the mountains of Italy. While tending his flocks on the fertile mountain sides someone with an artistic eye discovered that the frolicked, half-naked shepherd boy had developed a marvelous talent for making figures out of mud. He modeled sheep mostly, though other forms were wrought from the pliable earth, which lent itself so admirably to Giotto's genius. He also drew wonderful charcoal figures on the rocky ledges of the mountainsides. The stories of this remarkable

shepherd spread afar, finally reaching Rome. At that time it happened that the famous architect, Cimabue, was on the lookout for artists to adorn the churches and cathedrals for Pope Boniface VIII. When the story of the shepherd boy got to his ears he made a pilgrimage to the place where Giotto lived. Meeting the little Giotto, the great Cimabue said: "Give me evidence of your skill as an artist."

Without a moment's hesitation the little Giotto took a stick of charcoal and drew an O so singularly round and perfect that the great architect was amazed. The boy was at once taken to Rome and soon gained wide fame as an artist and sculptor.

And so the expression, "Round as Giotto's O," came into use in Italy, and is now often heard in English.
