### THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

#### Bribery and Corruption.

SIR.—A number of the clergy and laity in Canada have recently expressed their opinions in strong terms of disapproval of the political bribery and corruption at present carried on by the people's representatives and their party followers. To read those utterances of warning and denunciation one might be led to believe that a resort to ways that are dark and mysterious on the part of politicians to retain their hold upon public patronage is something unprecedented in the history of our country. But this is not so. Political bribery did not originate with the present Federal or Provincial Governments, nor with their Tory predecessors. Its birth dates further back into the dim past than many of our moralists and teachers of an ideal system of practical ethics may suppose. It is only a modified form of the pillage of the weak by the strong. It was

conceived in lust of power and worship of mammon and nurtured in the common delusion that might makes right and that the end justifies the means. It has grown and flourished side by side with the increase of trade and extension of commerce until in its present stage of development and under its malign influence the ballot system is rendered a nullity and parliamentary representation a miserable farce. It is upheld in its present strength and efficiency by capitalism.

It benefits the privileged class of idlers at the expense of the laboring poor. It provides for the parasite, rewards the party hack and feeds henchmen and toadies at the public expense. It is indispensable to the maintenance of party politics and will continue as long as Grit or Tory remains as a catch-word in our midst.

It is a hydra-headed monster. When you lop off one head another appears in its stead. When the open purchase of votes is followed by a speedy punishment an attempt to render abortive the working of the ballot system is resorted to. When this offence is threatened with exposure some Judas betrays a constituency and sells himself to the support of any party or measure for the thirty pieces of silver.

While this sale of an individual representative for a certain specified sum of the people's money is going on the vote of a subsidy to some company or corporation or a public grant to some social or ecclesiastical institution, or it may be the purchase in some indirect way of a whole Province, is the most important development, any or all of which offences in the line of bribery may be looked upon as the inevitable outcome of a social and economic code which teaches and preaches by precept and example that doctrine so dear to the hearts of the exploiting classes—namely, the "survival of the fittest."

When the loaves and fishes so willingly and liberally provided by the people and their representatives allowed to control and distribute them to their individual interest, political aspirants of the baser sort will always be found ready to force or buy their way to a seat in the Legislature.

Men whose only qualification is empty vanity or trickery, or both, seek political honors with the sole desire for self-aggrandizement and public plunder. Born, nurtured and reared under a false social system which has always held dangling before their eyes the meritorious reward that awaits him who is so fortunate as to seize the coveted prize of power and self, regardless of the means or agencies employed to carry out the dark design in the fierce struggle of craft and trickery against honesty and merit, can it in any way surprise us that so many of our public men are low in morals, contracted in intellect, self-sufficient, greedy of gain, venal and corrupt?

Nor is there any apparent prospect of an immediate deliverance out of this political degradation into which we have unfortunately fallen. Repeated changes of Governments have been tried in vain by the people from Grit to Tory and Tory to Grit without avail. Each party is pure and undefiled while in opposition but corrupt and venal when it attains to power. Why is this? Will some one, if such there be in this country, who has burst the shackles of party prejudice and risen above its cramping leading influence upon the human mind, come forth and let us know?
