THE FUNNIEST THING

The funniest thing in the Canadian political situation today is Mr. MacKenzie King's glorification of what he calls his national policy, just as if it were something of his own creation. He is, or appears to be, ridiculously oblivious to the fact that every sane man and woman in Canada knows he and his party accepted this particular brand of "National Policy" from the Progressives at the point of a revolver as an alternative to going to the country. Neither Mr. King nor any of his party could just then face the country and so they accepted the alternative. Now, Mr. King tries to think the whole thing was his own invention and the greatest thing Canada ever had! Funny, ain't it? And yet there are people in Canada who do not enjoy a joke!

Barbarians and savages rarely become insane. The dark races of Africa, alike in their ignorance and superstition, show no such indications of insanity as do the white races. The negroes transplanted from Africa to the Southern States of America very rarely become insane while they were in slavery. Their food, clothing and shelter were provided for them and the majority of them did not worry. Since obtaining their freedom they have gone insane in large numbers. With them, as many of their white neighbors the hard problem of making a living has caused anxiety and worry which have long been fruitful causes of insanity.

It is a paradox that people today should be healthier in body, live longer and yet be more subject to mental disease than their ancestors. It contradicts the accepted theory of "the sound mind in the sound body." If our bodies are not sounder than those of our parents why should we live longer than they? Again, many features and qualities of mind and body are inherited from our parents. Some diseases of body or of mind, or a predisposition thereto are apparently also inherited. The proportion between what is thus inherited and what is acquired by the individual has not been determined and probably may never be known.

Great progress has been made by medical science and skill in the treatment of mental disorders and the number of recoveries in connection to the number treated we live.
