GASOLINE BOAT BURNED

On the night of October 31st, a boat loaded with gasoline, passing west through the straits caught fire when opposite Red Point and was burned to a wreck. As the night was calm the five occupants got aboard the small boat they were towing and rowed away from the burning mass. Some citizens of Kingsboro and Red Point who saw the blaze hurried to the scene in motor boats. The remains of the wreck were towed into Little Harbor. It is understood that the fire was caused by the back firing of one of the engines when the tank was being replenished with gasoline. The boat was from Pictou, N. S., and the name of the owners is at present unknown.

RETURNS FROM AMHERST FAIR

Mr. M. W. Wood of Highland Farm, Southport, returned from the Amherst Winter Fair on Friday. Mr. Wood spoke in high praise of the interest taken in the Fair, and especially in the Fox Show, by the large number of visitors. He was impressed with the splendid accommodation provided for exhibitors and of the fine arrangement made for the housing of the foxes. The parade of prize foxes was a most popular event. The parade was conducted upon the judging table in the fox arena and was observed by hundreds of people who admired the various prize winners. Mr. Wood was well pleased with the very fine showing that his "Wondercrest" foxes made. He entered eight and won four firsts and four seconds, as well as prizes for groups and herds. He was the second highest winner in the classes at the Show, the highest being Mr. John A. Lea of Summerside who with seven entries won five firsts and two seconds. Island foxes made a clean sweep winning every major award except two which were for new exhibitors.
