The people of Donagh have also a daily morning mail delivered almost as early to them, as to the residents of Charlottetown; also the old historic Johnston's River Poll was ever in their district, which goes to show the people of Donagh were always progressive even in the early days. No doubt "Observer" will say, "no wonder I could not find Donagh with Johnston's River their address and Donagh the name of the school district. No other place on earth has such a condition." I will admit it is a little twisted, like the Irishman in New York, who was sleeping in his boarding house, which took fire. A fireman woke him up. Pat grabbed his pants and put them on front side behind. Sometimes after the fireman seeing Pat moping around asked him if he was hurt. "No, not hurt," said Pat, "but badly twisted." However, the Post Office was named after the river, which runs into the district, and the school bears the name of the birthplace of the first settlers, who came to Donagh. I might add there are other places similar, the Johnston's River West which is known as Mt. Ryan and Johnston's River. It is one district, their address for many years was Mt. Ryan, which was the name of their office, and today their church is known as Mt. Ryan Church and their school, which is beside the church is Johnston's River School. However "Observer" says Mt. Ryan and Johnston's River are on the map. This is a privilege a district must be proud of, as we in Donagh feel pleased, marked Donagh and Johnston's River, so we are on the map twice. Congratulations Mt. Ryan and Johnston's River. Now "Observer" has endeavored to reflect on many districts from evident malice against those places, which is clear to all but he has only succeeded in breaking one of the greatest commandments "Love thy neighbor as thyself." and also placing Donagh on the map in two places. Don't let Observer be meaner than Judas, who was man enough to show his face when he committed his awful crime.

Mrs. Rose Quinn was another sister.

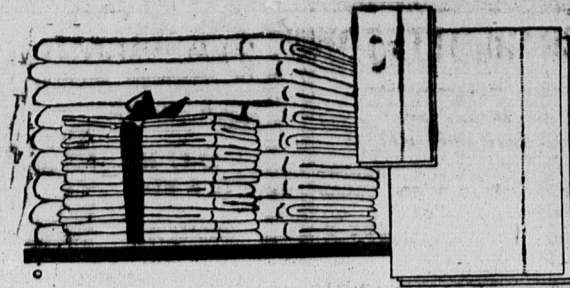
LETTER OF SYMPATHY
