NOTICE

CLAIMS FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE ARISING DIRECTLY FROM OPERATIONS OF WAR DURING THE SECOND WORLD WAR.

1. Claims for loss or damage arising directly from operations of war during the Second World War may be filed with the Department of the Secretary of State of Canada, War Claims Branch, Custodian's Office, Ottawa, Canada on or before January 31, 1949, by any person who is resident in or carrying on business in Canada or who is a Canadian citizen in Canada or outside of Canada.

2. Any claim must be filed in quadruplicate in the form of an affidavit disclosing the following information: (a) The full name and change of name, if any, of the claimant, together with address; (b) The former and present nationality of the claimant, including the place, number and date of issue of his naturalization or citizenship certificate, if any; (c) Full particulars of the character and amount of the claim, including location and value of any property of which ownership is claimed, if the property was insured, state name of insurer, number of policy and amount insured for; (d) Description of the claimant's title to the property, together with copies of the documents evidencing ownership, also names and addresses of persons now in possession or custody of the property; and the names and addresses (if possible) of any person connected with the transfer of the property if such transfer was unauthorized by the legitimate owner; (e) If the property has been lost or damaged state the circumstances of any damage, by whom caused and the date of occurrence, so far as known, together with any other relevant information.

3. Full particulars should be given of any claim previously made in reference to the same subject matter, with details as to the date of filing, the government (Canadian or otherwise) and the Department of such government with which such claim was filed and their reference number.

4. Full particulars should also be given as to the character and amount of any partial settlement or compensation (including any payment made in respect to any insurance) which has been received by the claimant in respect of any claim.

5. Claims will be received for the purpose of record only and no award does the Government of Canada or the Secretary commit itself or himself to the responsibility for the correctness of any claim, to the taking of action for the recovery of the claim or property in question, or with respect to settlement thereof or otherwise.
