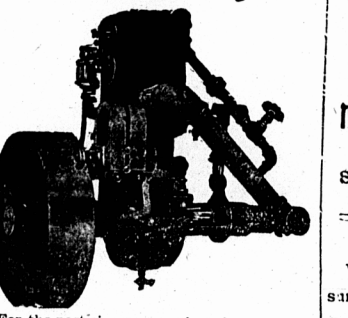

## FOOTBALL BETWEEN REGIMENTS.

It is all too seldom that one is able in a very busy football season to get away from the big clubs, but on Monday I managed to get to Aldershot to see the final for the Army Association Cup. The teams were the Royal Artillery (Shoeburyness) and the 2nd Royal Irish Rifles. The Irish won by the only goal scored. And they were proud men indeed, for the Prince of Wales motored over with the Princess and little Princess Mary and Prince Arthur and succeeded in making the occasion worth the remembering. I have seldom seen so many people at a match of this character. It seemed as if all Aldershot had dumped itself down in the playing field, and the enthusiasm was unbounded. The football was what one expected it to be—a fight to the last gasp, in which no man spared the other. Such charging one rarely sees; it would have frightened most of our professionals, who are ridiculously passive. It was all good sport, and everybody enjoyed it.

I shall be very surprised if young Prince Arthur does not take to football very seriously. He was chockful of enthusiasm, and I happened to know that he had close knowledge of the technique of the game. When it was all over, and the camp followers of the Irishmen were cheering as only Irishmen can cheer, the referee handed the ball to Prince Arthur, who hugged it affectionately. Then the captain of the rifles, a big, six-foot-three man, who in the scrambling for the ball had only just been beaten for possession, lined up with his comrades to receive the cup and medals from the Princess of Wales. Prince Arthur, though he gave one the impression that he would have dearly liked to have taken the ball home with him, had apparently noticed that the Irish captain was sore distressed because he had not succeeded in making it his own particular property, and with great chivalry that brought forth rousing cheers, handed it to the soldier. And the lusty Irishman was happy. I came away from Aldershot convinced that there was more life and color in Army football than there is in most of our big League games. Army football is a thing apart.

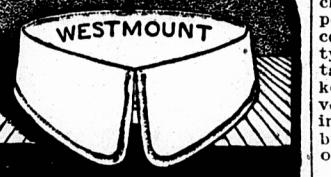
Not until the very close did she reappear. Then, as she assisted him to the carriage, a fresh misgiving smote him suddenly.

## THE OLD NOVELS AND THOSE OF TODAY.

Those of us who are old enough to be in a position to draw comparisons must often feel how lamentably short of those of past days. In some respects the workmanship of the present day novel is an improvement upon the old style, but in the art of character portrayal they are far below the standard of their predecessors.

Are not the many types of men and women who passed in procession through the pages we loved and still love, as real to us as the men and women we meet in everyday life? Are they not types of all phases of human nature and character?

We meet a man and as we come to know him we think "Ah! here is a Colonel Newcombe, or a Pecksniff or a Charles Primrose," so powerfully has that type been impressed upon us by the vehicle of expression, perhaps less good artistically than that used by latter novelists. The art of the short story writer is far greater than of old, but then may we not almost say that the short story, belongs entirely to the present day! Of course it may perhaps with some truth be answered that our minds were young, our interest keen, when we read these books and that we bring to the perusal of the books of the later day an interest less keen, but making all allowance for that fact, few of the characters of the newer novels are portrayed with truth, power and sincerity sufficient to make of them types which we are almost forced to take, home to our hearts where we keep them, cherishing them with a very actual affection, others remaining as firmly fixed in our imaginations but which we hold in active dislike or detestation as the case may be.

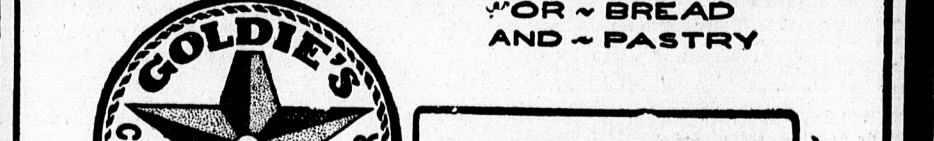
