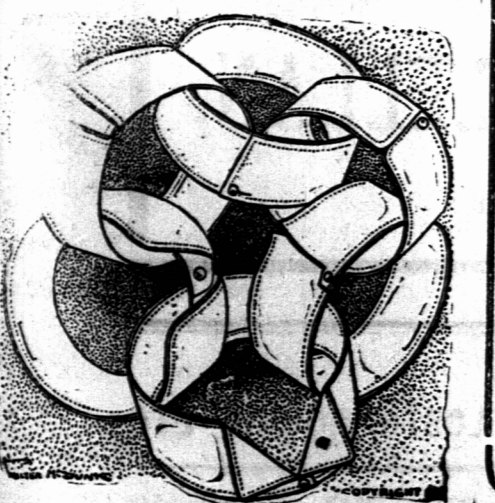

Rev. J. A. McDougall occupied the pulpit of the Presbyterian Church, Tryon, on Sabbath last at 2:30, p. m. and delivered an eloquent and very highly appreciated address to the members of Victoria, Prince Arthur, and Searle Lodges, L. O. A., and many members from sister Lodges. The Church when taxed to its utmost capacity could not accommodate more than half of these who sought admission. Appropriate music was rendered by the choir in a very excellent manner. The Reverend gentleman spoke from 1 Cor. 16: 13. After a brief introduction in which he explained the origin of society in general, and the necessity of secret societies in particular, he spoke of the "faith once delivered into the saints" under the similitude of a previous treasure bearing the impress of our King, Priest, and Prophet. This we were called upon in the text to guard with vigilance, standing upon the sure Foundation, persisting in our efforts, manifesting the spirit of true manhood, and continually trusting in our Supreme Ruler. To do this we must be loyal to our God, and in the doing of it we must of necessity be loyal to our King who is preeminently a "Defender of the Faith. He then showed that the principles of the Orange Society included loyalty to both, and exhorted the members to be faithful to their trust. The sermon throughout was a masterpiece of eloquence and oratory, and was delivered with great earnestness. The service closed with the singing of the Doxology in which all joined with a heartiness seldom seen. We trust that we may again have the privilege of hearing Mr. McDougall in the near future, and hope that he may be long spared to render such efficient service for his Master.

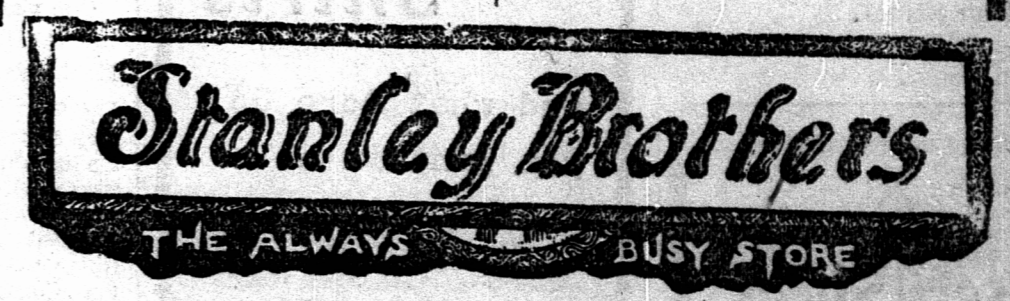
