CHARACTER AND THE HANDWRITING.

Upon analysing the origin of that feeling, it will be found that it is caused by the lacking touch of personality.

The erased word, the tiny ill-concealed blot, the word mispelt, the word crossed out—all breathe the writer's personality, whereas, the typed letter loses half its human interest. No matter whether the writer of the letter be perfect in all the details of her calligraphy or a thorough-going dunc; whether her letter is fair as copper-plate or whether it resembles a conglomeration of Chinese hieroglyphics and is well-nigh impossible to puzzle out, it is characteristic of our friend, and to criticize adversely what she has written would seem an actual act of disloyalty. A few years ago, when the Bishop of Ripon was speaking at Leeds, he made some reference to type-written letters between friends, remarking that the typewriting machine could never supersede the deep touch of interest which came from the human hand. He prized the letters that came to him from friends when written by his own hand. I think most people will coincide with the view of the matter taken by the Bishop of Ripon.
