BRITISH REPRESENTATION. With all Ireland's wrongs there is one point in regard to which she enjoys more than an equality with the sister Kingdoms. We refer to the matter of her representation in the Imperial Parliament. With a population now less than that of Scotland she is privileged to elect 103 members to the House of Commons while Scotland elects but 72 members. In England and Wales there is but one member for each 65,700 of the present population; in Scotland one for 62,110 and in Ireland one for 43,253.

One of the ratios between population and representation in England were made general throughout the United Kingdom England and Wales would of course have their present number of 495 members, while Scotland could have but 68 and Ireland would hardly be entitled to so many as Scotland, making in all a House of 631 members. But it is to be observed that in the early days of the union and down nearly to the middle of last century Ireland was under-represented. In 1801 with one third of the population of the United Kingdom she had less than one sixth of the representation.

In Canada we have become so accustomed to representation in proportion to population that comparatively slight variations from the standard call for a periodical readjustment after each census. In the Old Country the fact of Ireland or Scotland being under or over represented attracts apparently but little attention. I would we think have been better had our constitution provided that no part of the original representation of a Province should be taken away. As it is Prince Edward Island has already lost one of her original number of six representatives of the Commons, and is in another present danger of shortly losing another. We may escape for the time but it will evidently be a pretty narrow escape.

THE OTTAWA SESSION. When Parliament assembled on 6th February last the Government majority was thought to be about 45. At the first real test of strength, on Mr. Borden's amendment to the motion to go into supply the amendment was defeated by a majority of 54.

Both Houses were presided over by new Speakers during the session, Mr. Brodeur in the Commons and Hon. Mr. Power in the Senate, both of whom appear to have shown themselves well qualified and impartial. The Opposition had also a new leader in the person of Mr. R. L. Borden of Halifax, and his course during the session appears to have been highly satisfactory to his followers, who have taken a strong liking to him. He has been very cautious, very courteous in debate, and at the same time has evinced watchfulness and ability.

The measures adopted during the session include a supply bill larger than ever before passed by a Canadian Parliament; the creation of a branch of the Royal Mint at Ottawa; a settlement of one of our Island claims by a new subsidy of \$30,000 a year; a subsidy of \$100,000 a year for steam service between Canada and France; a bill providing three additional Judges for Quebec, which had been rejected by the Senate last year; an amendment to the election law providing a new form of ballot and making a certified check good for a candidate's deposit; a bill providing pensions for officers and men of the militia after 20 years' service, with 5 per cent deductions from officers' salary toward making the pensions good; a bill making the 24th of May a perpetual holiday; a measure to prevent fraud on

farmers and other consumers of binder twine, requiring the length per pound to be stamped on the ball. These and many acts of incorporation and amending acts of various kinds constituted the bulk of the session's work. Over 100 of the members of the Commons were new to parliamentary life, and they appear to have joined with great alacrity with the older members and Senators in raising their sessional pay from \$1,000 to \$1,500 each. Both parties were equally committed to this change, the leader of the Opposition having seconded the resolution to that end which was moved by the Premier.

The New York Work estimates that this year 75,000 persons will be divorced in the United States. The increase in the rate of divorces is alarming. In 1870 only 34 per cent of the marriages were dissolved and in 1900 eight per cent ended in the divorce court. The number of divorces in all other civilized countries taken together do not equal the number in the United States. This condition has become a national peril. The family is the unit of all government, and where family relations are so unstable as above noted the state is in danger. Easy divorce is a short road to national ruin.
