In the burnt district of Summerside there are left many reminders of hard fought battles with fire and smoke, one of the principal being the home of J. M. Noonan. Like the famous "Charge of the Light Brigade" it had fire to the front of it, fire to the left of it and fire behind it and smoke and flame over it. Still it remains. The stranger on viewing it repeatedly asks, "How was it saved?" Mr. Noonan's house is furnished with water-works and hose of his own, which did him able service in the hour of need. When the heat became so intense as to prevent the removal of the remaining part of the furniture, then began a long hard struggle to save his house which was hid from view by smoke and flame. So long at one time that the words on many lips were: "It's gone! It's gone!" but when the smoke subsided a little it became apparent to everyone that it still remained. As help was scarce Mr. Noonan had to make the best of it with what help he got. At one time it was awful for Mr. Noonan, left his handsome home, smothered and exhausted, fully expecting never to see it again. Yet the scale of fate was turned by a kind young lady who, on seeing his exhausted condition immediately procured a glass of milk, which revived his strength in a short time and springing to his feet he vowed he would save his home; which he did. Had Mr. Noonan not saved his home, other handsome ones would have followed in its wake, and nothing short of divine would have saved the Catholic and Methodist churches. Yet Mr. Noonan suffered heavily besides, in the loss of his house on Water Street, and his handsome coach house and stable behind his home, without insurance on either, while the home he saved with almost superhuman efforts was insured for three thousand six hundred dollars.

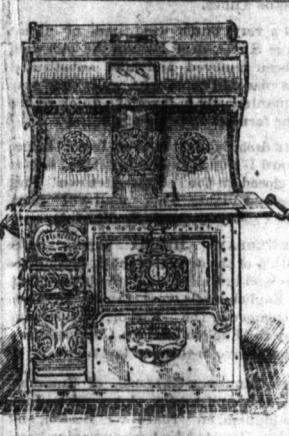
