MONTREAL, Jan. 10 (CP)—Prices generally were steady and unchanged in quiet trading on the produce section of the Canadian commodity exchange today.

MONTREAL, Jan. 10 (CP)—Prices for creamery butter prints are steady, continuing to climb as receipts dwindled on open produce markets here today, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Most other offerings hung to yesterday's steady levels.

Creamery butter prints to retailers were 24-24 1/2 cents a pound and solids 23 1/2-24. Western butter delivered Montreal was offered at 23 1/4-1/2 for fresh or regraded. Que. No. 1 pasteurized in wholesale lots was 23 1/4 for regraded.

Ont. white and colored sold for 12 cents a pound. Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 24 cents a dozen for A-large, 23 for A-medium, 22 for A-pulls.

Stocks Stage Slight Rally In New York

NEW YORK, Jan. 10 (CP)—After having lost virtually all of its pre-Christmas upturn, the stock market today took a mild turn on the rallying side. Weak airings of the program session led the revival on hopes the president's national defence message, due tomorrow or the next day, would bring the rearmament theme more strongly into the speculative limelight.

Gains ran to 2 or more points at the best, but these were substantially reduced at the close as traders cashed profits.

Canadian issues were mostly steady with some inactive. Distillers-Seagram, Dome, International Nickel, Molayre, Hollinger and Lake Shore all advanced fractionally while Ford eased slightly.

Propping steels was the announcement of U. S. Steel Corp. Shipments for December were highest since October, 1937. A predicted less than seasonal decline in January motor sales aided the automotive group.

Best stock performers included Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, Sperry, Gen Martin, U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, General Motors.

Dealings were slowest for any 5-hour day since Dec. 9. Transfers totalled 713,150 shares against 1,000,000 yesterday. The Associated Press average 60 stock price returned a net advance of .1 of a point at 52.

Rails and utilities held to a narrow groove throughout.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Jan. 10 (CP)—Receipts today on Montreal live-stock markets were 234 cattle, 282 calves, 1,157 hogs and 116 sheep and lambs.

Cattle prices were steady. Veal cows and hogs were easier. Lambs were lacking in quality.

Cattle were steady. A few good heifers sold at \$5.50 to \$6 with medium kinds up to \$5. Good cows brought \$4.50 to \$5.25 with medium kinds from \$3.75 to \$4.25. Canners and cutters were \$2.25 to \$3. Common bulls made from \$3.25 to \$4.25.

Calves were steady to 25 cents easier. Medium good to good veals brought \$10 to \$10.50 with medium kinds around \$9.50 and common light veals down to \$8.50. The bulk of the veals brought between \$8.50 and \$9.50. Drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$8 and grassers \$4.25 to \$4.50.

A few good ewes and wethers were sold at \$8.50. The balance of the lambs were mostly bucks and ranged from \$6.50 to \$7. Sheep sold from \$3 to \$5.

All the hogs received were on former contract. There were no fresh sales. Weak undertone.

Packers' buyers assert that too large a percentage of the hogs brought \$4.50 at present are over-finished or too fat.

Currencies

MONTREAL, Jan. 10 (CP)—London Sterling declined 3-32 of a cent on Montreal foreign exchange today to \$4.72 7/32 while the United States dollar gave up 1-32 at 7-8 premium. French francs were off slightly to 2.66 1/16 cents.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10 (AP)—Foreign exchange traders took to the sidelines today as Prime Minister Chamberlain headed for Rome to discuss European political problems with Premier Mussolini.

Fluctuations were narrow and uneven in terms of the United States dollar. Sterling ended 1-16 cent higher at \$4.67 1/16 while the French franc advanced .00 3/16 cent to 2.63 5/8. The gulder dipped .01 cent, the Swiss franc added .02 cent and the belga was unchanged. The Canadian dollar improved 1-32 to a discount of 7-8.
