**\$52,000 FOR SEAT IN N. Y. STOCK EXCHANGE.**  
New York February 15.—High price records for the payment of a stock exchange seat were broken again when Charles I. Gates, a son of John W. Gates, of American Steel Wire fame, paid \$51,000 for a membership. To this price must be added the initial fee of \$1,000 making the total cost of the seat \$52,000. The old high record was \$41,500.
