Over The River.

The authoress, Nancy Amelia Woodbury Priest, was born at Hinsdale, New Hampshire, in 1837, and died in 1870. "Over the River" was first published in the Springfield Republican, Aug., 1857, and appears to be the only production, with one exception, by which the writer is known.

Over the river they beckon to me, Loved ones who've crossed to the farther side, The gleam of their snowy robes I see, But their voices are lost in the dashing tide. There's one with ringlets of sunny gold, And eyes the reflection of heaven's own blue, He crossed in the twilight gray and cold, And the pale mist hid him from mortal view; We saw not the angels who met him there, The gates of the city we could not see; Over the river, over the river, My brother stands waiting to welcome me.

Over the river the boatman pale Carried another, the household pet, Her brown curls waved in the gentle gale,— Darling Minnie! I see her yet. She crossed on her bosom her dimpled hands, And fearlessly entered the phantom bark; We felt it glide from the silver sands, And all our sunshine grew strangely dark. We know she's safe on the farther side Where all the ransomed and angels be; Over the river, the mystic river, My childhood's idol is waiting for me. For none return from those quiet shores, Who cross with the boatman cold and pale; We hear the dip of the golden oars And catch a gleam of the snowy sail, And lo! they have passed from our yearning hearts; They cross the stream and are gone for aye. We may not under the veil apart That hides from our vision the gates of day; We only know that their barks no more May sail with us o'er life's stormy sea; Yet, somewhere, I know, on the unseen shore, They watch and beckon, and wait for me.

And I sit and think, when the sunset's gold Is flushing river and hill and shore, I shall one day stand by the water cold, And list for the sound of the boatman's oar, I shall watch for the gleam of the flapping sail, I shall hear the boat as it gains the strand, I shall pass from sight with the boatman pale, To the better shore of the spirit land; I shall know the loved ones who have gone before, And joyfully sweet will the meeting be. PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

And its Attractions To Tourists.

Prince Edward Island's summer climate is delightful, and scenery is beautiful and quietly picturesque. Surrounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, it enjoys all the coolness of the sea breeze and the advantages that can only be derived from sea bathing at about 65 degrees.

Charlottetown has over 12,000 inhabitants, and is the capital. It has many great retail stores, besides a large wholesale trade. It has a Gas Light and Power Company two Electric lights plants, and a street railway is in embryo. It has a first class water works and sewerage system. It is famed for its many pleasant drives the principal of which is the new Park Boulevard, its attractive surroundings, pure water and clear cool and bracing air. It is widely known as one of the healthiest cities in Canada. It has two hospitals, many churches and a large and elegant new Opera House. It also has several fine public buildings and a market which is one of the chief resorts of the citizens here. It has one of the largest and best equipped pork-packing establishments in the Dominion. On the west sides in the Park; on the east side are the magnificent new Exhibition Building and Driving Park. Chief among its public squares are Queen Square in the centre of the city, beautifully laid out with blooming plants of every description, a fountain and well arranged walks, and enlivened with a band of music during the summer evenings. The rural scenery in the vicinity of Charlottetown is charming, and horses for driving are abundant at very low prices. Boats can also be hired, and steamers run regularly on the bays and rivers, affording most pleasant excursions. The principal hotels are Davies, Queen, and Revere.

Summerside has above 3000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedeque Bay. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitated for. The hotels are—Clifton, Queen, Rass, Strathcona and Campbell.

Georgetown and Souris have a population of about 1,000 each. In the former are, Tupper, Revere, Dominion, McConnell, Manuel and Globe hotels and in Souris the Sea View.

At Cape Traverse a very pleasant summer resort, is the Landsdown Hotel; in Alberton, the Albion Terrace and Wisner in Tignish the Railway and Bellevue; in Kensington, Clark's and Commercial; in Montague, McDonald, and in Mount Stewart, Clark's and Manson's.

The following hotels open for the summer season: At Hampton, Pleasant View at Stanhope, Mutche's, and Cliff; at Brackley Point, Shaw's; at Rustico, Seaside; at Malpeque, North Shore; at Tracadie Beach, Acadia; at Alberton, Seaforth; and at Pownal, Florida.

In addition to those already mentioned here are other towns and villages in the Province with hotel accommodations, while many farm houses prepare for the reception of tourists. The rivers and streams teem with trout, the bays with mackerel, while game of every description abounds.
