A GRAND celebration will be held in Emerald on St. Patrick's Evening, March 17th, when a musical, literary, and dramatic entertainment will be given under the auspices of Emerald Branch B. I. S. A competent "Dramatic Personnae" will present the thrilling drama "The Irish Agent". The oration will be given by Rev. J. M. Forbes, Crapaud. Instrumental music will be given by the Kensington Orchestra. In addition, readings will be given by Miss Flo McKenzie, Charlottetown, which alone should attract a good house; and solos will be sung by Mr. Geo. Hennessey. A pleasant evening is guaranteed to all who attend.

The Elder-Dempster steamship Monterey, Captain Parry, which will shortly sail from Halifax for South Africa with the Strathcona Horse, will fly a unique flag, on which will be emblazoned the arms of Lord Strathcona on a red shield mounted on a white ground. The shield is divided into three parallel bars, and bears first the maple tree and beaver, second a tomahawk and spike crossed, and third, four voyageurs in a canoe. The whole is surmounted by a coronet. The flag has been made in Montreal, to the order of Messrs. Elder-Dempster & Co., and will be an interesting feature of the decoration of the vessel.

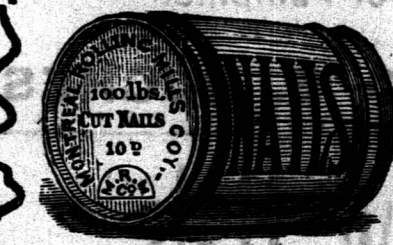
