BRITAIN REFUSES SAFE CONDUCT TO AUSTRIAN MINISTER

The New Austro-Hungarian Ambassador to United States will Receive No Favor from Britain.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) LONDON, Nov. 28.—The Foreign Office has sent Ambassador Page a note definitely refusing to grant a safe conduct to Count Adam Tarnowski, the new Austro-Hungarian Ambassador to the United States.

TWO GERMAN ZEPPELINS BROUGHT DOWN IN FLAMES

Of Three Zeppelins that Attempted a Raid on England Two with Their Crews Perished, Making Five Zeppelins Destroyed During Three Recent Raids.

LONDON, Nov. 28.—Two Zeppelins were brought down in Monday night's raid on the northeast coast of England. The crews of both airships perished. Reports from the north of England indicate that the latest raid by German airships was futile as far as the infliction of any damage was concerned.

INDIA REGARDS VICTORY CERTAIN FOR THE ALLIES

Great Enthusiasm Among all Classes to Win the War. Generous Gifts are Being Made by the Ruling Princes.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) LONDON, Nov. 28 (via Reuter's Ottawa Agency).—A special despatch from Delhi says: The Viceroy, Lord Chelmsford, who has been making a tour of India, has been nearly three months, is finding everywhere keen enthusiasm among all classes to win the war.

15 VESSELS SUNK BY GERMAN U-BOATS IN PAST FEW DAYS

(Special to the Guardian.) LONDON, Nov. 29.—German submarines have sunk fifteen (15) or more vessels in the past few days. One of the sunken steamers was the Chemung of New York, bound for that port from Genoa.

THE WAR SUMMARY

(Special to the Guardian.)

LONDON, Nov. 28.—Operations of the Teutonic Allies in Roumania have brought them appreciably nearer Bucharest. They are still progressing from the northwest and the south southwest. The northern bank of the Danube in Roumania, extending westward from Giurgiu, on the railroad south of Bucharest, to opposite Vidin, a short distance from the Serbian border, is in the hands of the forces of the Central Powers.

SERIOUS SITUATION IN FREIGHT TRANSPORT

A situation is developing in connection with freight transportation between Charlottetown and Pictou which threatens very shortly to become serious if that point has not been already reached. The Car ferry, it will be remembered, was put on this route last Monday and has since been making daily round trips.

TURKEY NOW DEFIES THE UNITED STATES

Rescinds its Agreement to Allow Several Hundred Americans to Leave Turkey.

(Special to the Guardian.) WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—Word that the Turkish government has rescinded its previous agreement to allow several hundred Americans to leave the Turkish Empire via Jaffa was the cause of the State Department today.

CONFLICTING REPORTS.

Operations in Macedonia are somewhat clouded by reason of divergent reports. Berlin says that north of the Monastir railway while the Serbian war office claims that in the fighting along the front the Serbians at several points made advances of several hundred metres.

TURKISH REPORT

Sofia on the other hand asserts that attacks on Hill 1050 and the village of Paralovo were put down by the Bulgarians and Germans as likewise was the offensive in the Vardar region south of the village of Begoroditsa.

ON WESTERN FRONT

On the front in France and in the Austro-Italian theatre nothing but bombardments have taken place. South of Dvinzka on the Russian front artillery duels have been in progress. Considerable activity also has developed in the region of Riga. In the Carpathians the Russians have begun another attack against the Austro-Germans and fighting is now proceeding there. Petrograd admits that the Turks have occupied the towns of Adramed and Kossissogly south of Turkish Armenia.

VESSLS SUNK BY GERMANS

The American steamer Chemung has been sunk in the Mediterranean, off the coast of Spain by a German submarine. The crew was landed. Eight other vessels, two each flying British, French, Greek and Norwegian flags have been sunk either by mines or torpedoes. Their aggregate tonnage was about 20,000. In addition to the Danish steamer Vallemos has been captured by German.

SUB WARNINGS RECEIVED IN HALIFAX

HALIFAX, Nov. 28.—It was announced by C. H. Harvey, agent of the Marine and Fisheries department at an early hour this morning that the Sable Island had intercepted a message from the steamship Amerique sending out S. O. S. calls. Efforts are being made to find out if other steamers are going to the assistance of the Amerique.

ZEPPELIN AND CREW WERE LOST IN STORM

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 27.—Travellers from Munich arriving here reported that a new German super-Zeppelin was wrecked in Tuesday's gale between Friedrichshafen and Wilhelmshafen. Twenty-seven men are said to have perished in the accident, only one being rescued.
