## HIGH PRICES FOR FURS

Sable, Chinchilla and Lynx First in the Market.

NEW YORK, Feb. 22.—Lynx yielded with Russian Sable and Chinchilla for first honors at the fur sale in the Masonic Hall here today, the best lynx due to its scarcity bringing \$66. Five hundred and ten dollars was paid for the best Russian Sable, with one hundred and seventy dollars for the best Chinchilla. Wild cat brought as high as \$18 and showed an advance of 50 per cent. over fall prices on the northern skins. Several varieties of Japanese and Australian furs were also sold today at good prices. Grand total to date has reached \$5,200,000 with four days selling ahead.

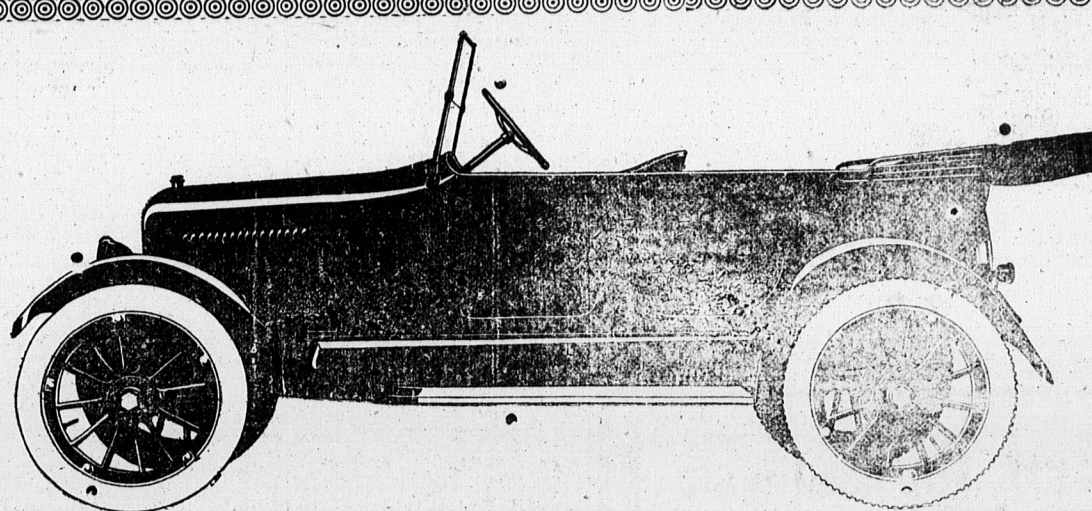
