### OPENING OF THE LEGISLATURE.

The opening of the Legislature yesterday was of the more interest to the general public from the fact that since the close of last session there has been a general election and a change of Government. The new ministers appeared for the first time in their official capacity, there is a larger number of new faces than is usual in the House, leading Conservatives and Liberals have changed seats and are located differently from what they were before. And it fell to the lot of the Premier of last session to administer the oaths of office to the members of this year.

The day's sitting was marked by brevity, and a business-like promptness in all that was done, and a reference to our legislative report will show that a considerable amount of formal and routine business was transacted which involved work and preparation in advance. The Address in reply will be moved for adoption today and will probably be disposed of without prolonged debate. This done, the House will be ready to enter upon its legislative duties, the reception of departmental reports, the consideration of public measures and

the voting of supplies for the fiscal year. It might have been supposed that the new Administration, having been but a few months in office and much occupied with matters long pending between the federal and provincial authorities, would not have had time to develop many important measures. There are, however, four measures promised in the Speech which deal with matters of very vital interest, the amendment of the School Act, the Improvement of Public Roads, Vote by Ballot and the Consolidation of the Statutes of the Province.

The scope of these measures is not yet disclosed except in the case of the introduction of the ballot, which has long been advocated in these columns and which we believe will be a welcome addition to our provincial election machinery. It has long been desired by many of the electors of both parties, and will place the Province in that regard in line with the other Provinces of the Dominion and of the Empire. The other measures proposed will be considered by The Guardian when we know their purport and contents were fully.

### LOOKING BACKWARD.

Sixteen years ago when the present editor of the Guardian undertook the discussion of public affairs and current events in this latitude, many of our public services were in a rather backward state and it is more than possible that in an ardent zeal for improvement and progress, and with face set to the future, some of the things achieved and the progress actually made may have been inadvertently overlooked or estimated below their true value. It is well some times to pause in our tasks and look backward in calm survey over past years.

In 1896 there was but one winter steamer plying between Prince Edward Island and the mainland. The railway to Murray Harbor, the bridge across the Hillsboro, the branch railways to Montague and Elmira were non-existent. The telegraph service to and from the outside world was operated only in the day time and the rates were most exorbitant. Within the period from 1896 down to the beginning of 1912 some other things were done that are worthy of a place in this recital. The sum of one million dollars was placed to our credit bearing interest at 3 per cent in liquidation of past failure to maintain an adequate winter steam service, and an increase of our subsidy from Ottawa was obtained which was shared by all the Provinces.

were others supplied by the federal and local Governments,—the new railway station and workshops in Charlottetown,—with other handsome stations along the line, the Experimental Farm, new public provincial buildings at various points about the Province, new steel bridges and concrete culverts for our roads. It is a pleasure to group these works and services and recall them again to notice, although they had been mentioned and commended from time to time in these columns as the work was done in past years.

It is a pleasure to recall these things for diverse reasons. One reason is that no one whether Liberal or Conservative would like to be thought ungrateful, for what is done or attempted on our behalf, even if we never get quite all we want in this world. Another reason is that we would recall these achievements of the old Governments in order to stimulate and encourage the new governments we now have at Ottawa and here to do as well as they can, and as much better than the old Governments did for us as they can possibly do.

There is much yet to be done for our Province in order to give to our people equality of opportunity with their cousins across the Straits and we are glad to find the powers that be, federal and provincial, grappling with these problems in an earnest and energetic spirit. We are proud to give them full credit for so doing. But we are also bound to give due credit to their predecessors in office for what they did and tried to do to advance Prince Edward Island. Credit to whom credit is due. For our part we have never thought that either one party or the other is possessed of all the patriotism or ability of the country. A spirit of narrow partisanship is not good for this or for any country. But if our two parties can be brought to mutually stimulate each other to better and higher service for our common country a great good will be accomplished. And this we hope yet to see.
