**MAIL TRAIN DELAYED**—The mail train was delayed at Borden last night fifty minutes owing to heavy ice and snow encountered by the car ferry in crossing. The car ferry arrived at 4.45 p.m. and the mail train reached Charlottetown at 7.40 p.m. The track was heavy with snow.

**SCHOONER CLEARED**—The schooner Mary Hyda, Captain William Dicks, which was being loaded with produce at Montague by Mr. W. A. Poole was frozen in during the recent cold snap and loading was discontinued. Yesterday the S.S. Brant, Captain Bazil Kelly, succeeded in getting her clear of ice. She is now completing her loading and will be able to get away today or tomorrow.

**MONTCALM COALING**—Yes, today morning the Icebreaker Montcalm saw the S.S. Manon safely out of the harbor on her way to St. John's Nfld. She is now back in port taking on 175 tons of bunker coal. The captain reports ice conditions about the same. North westerly winds and frost would effectively seal up the harbor.

**BAD FIRE AT COLEMAN**—The residence of Mr. Anthony Lockhart, of Coleman, was completely destroyed by fire on Thursday evening, together with nearly all its contents. Mr. Lockhart was cooking stock feed in the out-house adjoining the kitchen when the building took fire and so rapidly did the flames gain away in the strong wind that only a pile of the "swivel" furniture could be saved. The loss, in which Mr. Lockhart has the sympathy of the community, amounts to upwards of \$500 with only a small insurance.
