During the past week activity has increased enormously at the lobster factory at Montague. With the first arrival of a lobster catch on Tuesday, the factory got into full swing, and has increased its tempo daily. In preparation for the season, Mr. Leon Johnston, manager of the Montague cold storage, has completely renovated the factory which is adjacent to the storage. The whole building inside has been painted white, new tables have been installed, three large ventilators and new facilities for the workers.

On their arrival the lobsters are placed in the cold storage plant where they are kept at a temperature of 34 degrees to 36 degrees Fahrenheit. When they are taken to the plant they are placed in the two shell boilers which are 3 ft x 6 ft x 1 1/2 ft. Here the lobsters are cooked and here their color changes from a green to a deep red.

The steam for cooking the lobsters is supplied from a 35 H.P. steam boiler with 80 lbs pressure. To supply water an electric pump has been installed, and in the eventuality of power failure a steam engine has been installed to carry on in place of the electric motor. After the lobsters have been cooked, they are taken to the cracking tables where the tail and claws are removed, and the claws broken by men expert in the use of the breaking knives.

The lobster parts are then taken to the meat removal table where the meat is removed from the tails and claws, and at the next table the meat is packed in the tins which hold three or four tails, a percentage of arm meat, and the remainder claw meat. The cans are then sealed by a sealer machine operated by Mr. Alec MacLellan, foreman of the factory. The cans are now placed in a room where they are sterilized for 35 minutes at 14 pounds pressure and 240 degrees Fahrenheit temperature. The finished product is then stored in the cold storage plant until sent to market.

Before being employed all workers were required to pass a medical examination. The main cold storage plant is under the foremanship of Mr. Lowell Peole and the office is under the capable management of Mrs. Leon Johnston. Mr. Alec MacLellan, the foreman of the factory, has had numerous years experience in canning factories and is most capable in this position.

As a special aid to the workers, wash basins and rooms have been installed, which are of considerable suitability to the employees. Mr. Johnston hopes to continue the packing throughout the summer, should there be a market for the later products. The resumption of canning is of great assistance in providing work for the many workers in this district, and Mr. Johnston is to be highly commended for his fine work, and is wished every success in his new enterprise.

Current prices reported are 16c a pound for canners and 22c a pound for markets. A shipment of live lobsters left Stadacona last week for Sea Foods Limited in Borden.
