Rural Mail Delivery. Sir - In the Winter Season, it is quite common to receive complaints that the rural carriers have failed to serve all boxes on their route or on certain days have failed to make their trip and complaints are also made by the carriers that the boxes in certain sections are not promptly broken after a snow storm. During the present winter on account of the several heavy snows, we have experienced several days, which made it impossible for the rural carriers to carry mail on certain days.

I have been requested by a representative farmer in one of the more remote rural districts to refer to this matter in the press and to point out to the Post Office Department the requirements of the Regulations which have been issued.

During the Winter Season, the rural carriers should be kept open and the approach to the box sufficiently clear of snow to enable the carrier to cover his route without being unnecessarily delayed or inconvenienced.

Rural mail box-holders should understand that it is not the duty of carriers to break the roads at a passable condition at all times and the highways travelled by a rural mail carrier will be considered sufficient reason for the Department withdrawing the service.

I trust that the requirements of the Rural Act as well as those of the Postal Department will be sufficient to impress upon all carriers the importance of keeping the winter roads at all times in a passable condition.

In order to further assist the carriers in the giving of a satisfactory mail service I would suggest that rural patrons have their names painted legibly on their boxes and also that every box be placed near the roadside and kept in an erect position.

French Prestige Raised In East. JERUSALEM, Jan. 17. France has achieved a great increase of her prestige throughout the Near East by her treaty with the Turkish Nationalists, by her surrender to them of the whole province of Cilicia, and by giving assurances of the assistance of the French in the final settlement of the Near Eastern question.

Mohammedans of Syria, Egypt and Palestine are beginning to look upon France as having assumed the role of champion of Islam in succession to Great Britain and the later efforts of Emperor William to become the "Defender of the Crescent."

Political observers here say that France has secured a genuine victory in the Near East as a result of the Ankara pact and that its means to the end of Allied cooperation in handling Turkish affairs.

Only yesterday the Mohammedans of Syria, Egypt and Palestine were all united in their denunciation of the French mandate over Mesopotamia and Syria.
