Dr. Bates traced the beginning of the effort to control venereal disease in Canada back to 1916. For the first time since 1932, when, as an economy measure, the Federal Government withdrew its financial support of the national program, a strong co-ordinated program between the Dominion, the Province and the public was made possible by the recently re-established grants and a division of venereal disease control at Ottawa.
