The latest news, first of all.  
 -Angus McKinnon, Coleman, was in Summerside Saturday.

-Lawyer Matthews, O'Leary, was in Summerside Saturday.

-Capt Jos Read, Summerside, has returned home from a business trip to Sydney.

-Mrs T. B. Woodman, Alberton, passed through Summerside Saturday returning to her home.

-The annual meeting of the Grand River Draying Co. will be held on Tuesday the 15th inst.

-Some complaints are being made that the ice is not pushed up the river to Wilnot and across the bay to Bedeque.

-A farmer and his wife, living near Summerside, figured in a slight run away accident last Saturday. Their horse became frightened of the train in the eastern part of the town and got away from the driver overturning and breaking up the sleigh pretty badly. The occupants were not injured.

-The meeting of the Dunk River Farmers' Institute held at West Newton, Lot 26, on Friday night last, was well attended, every seat in the large school being occupied. In the absence of the president, M. Muligan was called to the chair. After the reading and confirming of the minutes of the last meeting a statement of the condition of the institute was read by the Secretary. There are sixty-six members paid up being an increase of six over last year. The finances had also increased, the total being \$50.00 on hand \$23.00 of an increase. A circular letter from the Seed Fair Committee asking for funds was read. After some discussion during which the benefits of the Seed Fair was clearly proven the sum of twenty dollars was unanimously voted. John E. Sinclair of Springfield, who was present by invitation, was introduced, and gave an interesting address occupying one hour. Mr. Sinclair who was one of the commissioners sent by the Dominion Government to Europe last June to secure information about the pork industry, gave an account of the commission's visit to England, Ireland, Scotland and Denmark, and explained how hogs were bred, fed and cared for in those countries, and how ham and bacon was cured and shipped. He briefly alluded to the Dairy industry of Denmark, and what an important item for our feeding slim milk and sweet whey was considered there. Mr. Sinclair's address was a valuable one and so considered by all present. His answers to questions were most satisfactory. Charles Craig, Thomas Moyle, P. J. Smith, M. McKenna, C. C. Craig, and others, made brief speeches expressing their pleasure in being present, and thanking Mr. Sinclair for the estimable address he had listened to. A vote of thanks was given Mr. Sinclair by the meeting. The Secretary, L. U. Fowler, then called for, gave for the entertainment of the young people a reading which caused much merriment, and hearty applause. This closed a most interesting meeting of the institute. The next meeting will be held at North Bedeque at a date to be fixed by the president.

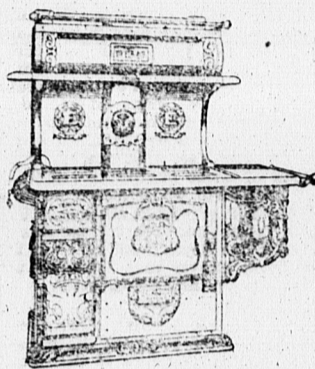
