By Doing so You Will Make a Merry Xmas Merrier all Around.

**W. F. MCLEAN'S IDEA RE NAVY**  
TORONTO, Dec 21—In addressing the South York Conservative Association here today Mr W.F. Maclean, M. P., for that district, advocated the sending of enough money to Britain by Canada to build several 'Dreadnoughts.' Mr Maclean said that Canada was essentially interested in maintaining the ability of the Empire for self-defence. In the United States he said the way was being paved for the absorption of many of the South American Republics which ultimately would result in a preponderance of the colored vote. In that event there would be only one way to equalize this and that would be by annexing Canada to swell the white vote to the continent. This would be one of the questions that Canada would have to 'ace' and she should be prepared for it.  
WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec 21—Aside from saving hundreds of lives and millions of dollars' worth of property in marine disasters, the United States life saving service managed to render assistance to many unfortunate persons in distress. The annual report of the superintendent of the service shows that a woman, "about to be hurled over a bluff," was rescued by a life guard, while an intoxicated man about to fall off a dock, a man who had lost his way in a march, another who had broken through the ice, two others who had climbed 100 feet up the fact of a cliff, and were unable to descend, and still another who tried to commit suicide, came within the vision of the vigilant guards and were saved. Five automobiles imperilled in marshes or quicksands were rescued.  
There were 1376 marine disasters involving the lives of 3900 persons that called the life saving service into activity. Seventy-two vessels were totally lost, although only thirty people gave up their lives in consequence. The total value of the property involved in these disasters was \$16,000,080, the value of property lost being \$2,295,380.

## ROOSEVELT ON THE NYANZA

ENTEBBE, Uganda, Dec 21—After a delightful voyage across the Victoria Nyanza, Mr Roosevelt and party arrived here today. At the pier they were met by Government officials. A guard of honor for the visitors was made up of Indian sikh. Mr Roosevelt and his son Kermit were driven in a motor car to the Government House, where they will be guests of the Governor of Uganda until their departure for Kampala tomorrow. Mr Roosevelt expressed himself as astounded at the beauty of the lake and the comfort provided for the steamer's passengers.
