A good steady demand prevails in the Montreal market for millfeed with prices well sustained and supplies none too plentiful. Sales are being made of Manitoba bran at \$27.25 per ton, shorts at \$28.25 to \$29.25 per ton, including bags.

THE BALED HAY MARKET

There was no new feature in the local market for baled hay yesterday, prices being maintained under a steady demand and a considerable scarcity of good hay. No. 2 timothy is quoted at \$30 to \$32 per ton, No. 3 timothy at \$28 to \$29 per ton and clover mixed hay at \$24 to \$25 per ton.

LIVE STOCK MARKETS

TORONTO, Aug. 11.—Cattle: Receipts 817. Cattle trade dragsy all day, at prices level with yesterday. Few storage heavy steers brought 8c, and best load butcher steers 7 1/4c. Fat cows were in demand at 5 to 5 1/2c. A few hundred cattle were left over. Quotations: Choice 8c to 8 1/2c; medium 7 1/2c to 7 3/4c; butcher steers choice at \$6.75 to \$7.25; common \$4 to \$5; butcher cows, choice \$4.50 to \$5; butchers \$3 to \$4.50; common \$2 to \$3; feeding steers good \$5.75 to \$6.50; fair \$5 to \$5.75; stockers good, \$4.25 to \$5; fair \$3.50 to \$4.15.

NEW YORK SUGAR MARKET

NEW YORK, Aug. 11.—The sugar market was steadily active today at 1 1/4 from Cubas, cost and freight, equal to 4.86c, for centrifugal; sales reported were 18,000 bags of Cubas to Philadelphia. Raw sugar futures were quiet and points lower under light liquidation. Refined raws steady, with prices ranging from \$9.00 to \$9.15 for fine granulated. Refined futures were 5 points lower at midday under liquidation, with trading confined to August.

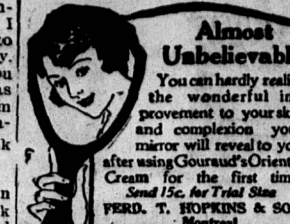
