### No Secrets For Commies Or Fascists

OTTAWA, June 22—(CP)—No work of a secret character within the Federal employ will be entrusted to any person "who is a member of the Communist Party or associated with it," Justice Minister Isley said today. He promptly told the Commons, too, that the same went for those of Fascist persuasion.

The Minister, replying to recent questions by John Diefenbaker (PC-Lake Centre), and Stanley Knowles (CCF-Winnipeg North Centre), said the Government "is satisfied that it would be a risk to the security of the state to employ such persons in positions of trust."

Outside the House, it was learned that security precautions have been checked up in spheres other than the backgrounds of employees. Physical measures, such as lockers or safes might gain admittance to secret projects, have also been ordered in such places as vital scientific projects being carried out by the National Research Council and the Defence Department.

Sections engaged on such work have appointed officials to supervise precautions as part of their duties.

Mr. Isley said the Government has rejected the idea of "setting up an elaborate organization, as had been done elsewhere (Britain), to determine and adjust upon the loyalty of its employees." It felt that "loyalty is not susceptible to any precise series of tests."

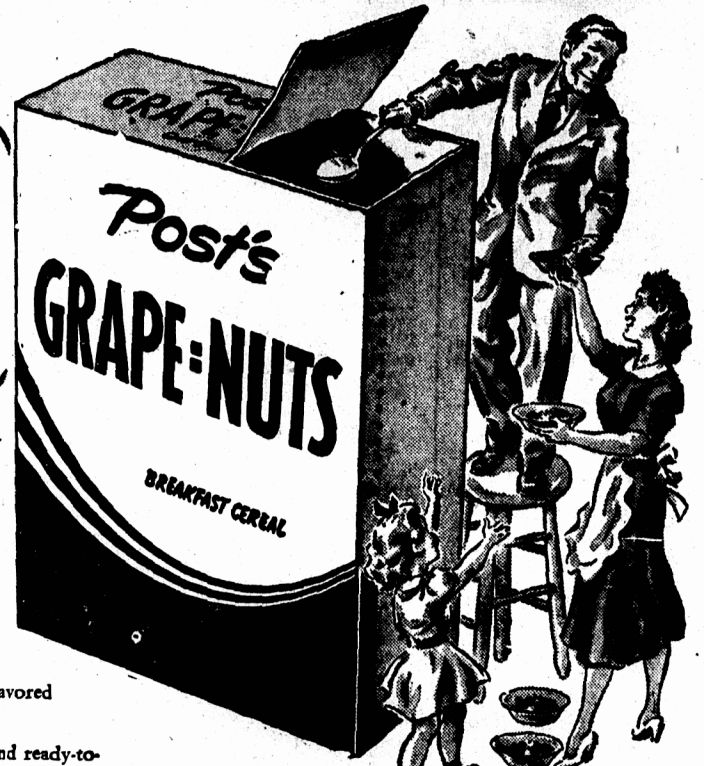
