PERENNIALS—WINTERED OVER. Carnations, Sweetwilliams, Dianthus—Forget-me-nots—Daisy—and Pansy in bloom at 50c. per doz. Ho-hoekia (very choice) 60c. per doz.—6 cents each—Dahlia tubbs mixed 6c. each 75c. per doz.

ANNUALS, Asters, Phlox, Verbenas, Petunia, Merigold, Portulaca, Zinnia stocks, Alyssum, Golden Feather, Nasturtium (tall and dwarf) Lobelia, Mignonette at 15c. per doz. Salvia Fireball and Seeding Pansies (very choice) 20c. per doz.

Please note that the following amounts for postage must be added to order when remitting—

For early Cabbage, Cauliflower and celery 10c. per hundred for postage. Late tomato 3c. per doz. Early tomato 5c. and late cabbage 6c. per hundred for postage.

The wintered over perennials 1c. each and annuals 2c. per doz. for postage.

Orders beyond the 20 mile limit unless for annuals or small quantities should be ordered to go by express—but by air means if coming to Charlottetown make it a point to call at our city market, you will save express charges and postage, and can personally select your plants.

Garden seeds such as Carrot, Beet, Parsnip, Lettuce, Radish, Cucumber, beans, Peas, etc., can be planted all June month. Our seeds are the same as we plant ourselves.

THE COLLIER STORSTAD IS NOW UNDER ARREST

MONTREAL, May 31.—With her bows crumpled in, and twisted around at an acute angle to port, and a gaping rent showing on the port side but a foot or so above the water line, in mute evidence of the tragedy in which she was figured the Norwegian collier Storstad limped into the harbor early this afternoon. A few minutes later a warrant of arrest, taken out by the Canadian Pacific Railway, was nailed to her mainmast by order of W. Simpson Walker, K. C., Registrar of the Quebec

Admiralty Court. "By what authority do you come on board my vessel and place it under arrest?" asked Captain Andersen, commander of the collier.

"By authority of the British Empire," curtly replied the Deputy Sheriff, who was commissioned to execute the warrant, and who forthwith proceeded to affix the warrant in the customary place. According to the report made by the Captain to the owners, immediately the collision occurred he heard Captain Kendall's shout calling upon him not to pull away.

CAPTAIN'S STATEMENT.

The statement is as follows: The fact that the Storstad has only today reached port has made it impossible heretofore to give an authoritative statement on her behalf. All connected with the Storstad deplore most deeply the terrible accident which has resulted in the loss of so many valuable lives. It is not with any desire to condemn other, but simply because it is felt that the public is entitled to know the facts, that the following statement is put forward: "The vessels sighted each other when far apart. The Empress of Ireland was seen off the port bow of the Storstad. The Empress of Ireland's green, or starboard, light was visible to those on the Storstad. Under these circumstances, the rules of navigation gave the Storstad the right, of way.

"The heading of the Empress was then changed in such a manner as to put the vessels in a possible way to pass safely. Shortly after, a fog enveloped first, the Empress, and then the Storstad.

"Fog signals were exchanged. The Storstad's engines were at once slowed and then stopped. Her heading remained unaltered. Whistles from the Empress were heard on the Storstad's port bows, and were answered. The Empress of Ireland was then seen through the fog close at hand, on the port bow of the Storstad. She was showing her green light, and was making considerable headway.

"The engines of the Storstad were at once reversed at full speed, and her headway was nearly checked when the vessels came together.

"It has been said that the Storstad should not have backed out of the hole made by the collision. She did not do so. As the vessels came together the Storstad's engines were ordered ahead for the purpose of holding her bow against the side of the Empress, and thus preventing the entrance of water into either vessel. "The headway of the Empress however, swung the Storstad around in such a way as to twist the Stor-

RESCUED 350 PERSONS

"The Empress at once disappeared in the fog. The Storstad sounded her whistle repeatedly in an effort to locate the Empress of Ireland, but could obtain no indication of her whereabouts until cries were heard. The Storstad was then manoeuvred as close to the Empress as was safe, in view of the danger of injury to the persons who were already in the water.

"The Storstad at once lowered every one of her boats, and sent them to save the passengers and crew of the Empress, though she herself was in serious danger of sinking. When two boats from the Empress reached the Storstad, the Storstad's men also manned these boats, and went in them to the rescue. Her own boats made several trips, and in all about 350 persons were taken on board and everything that the ship's stores contained was utilized for their comfort. The clothes of those on the Storstad were placed at the disposal of the rescued ones, and every assistance was rendered.

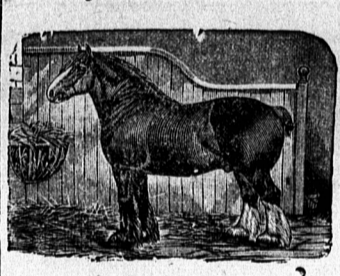

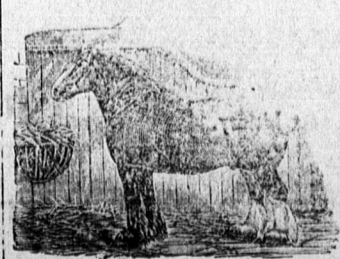

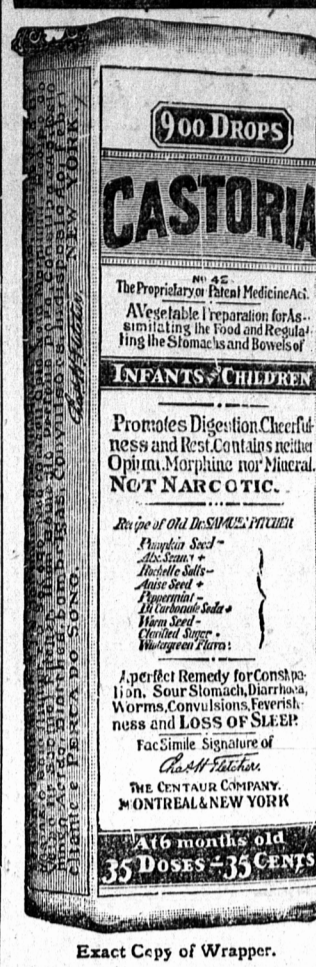
