For six years previous to 1908 a few automobiles had operated over all the roads of the Province without any restrictions whatever being placed upon them.

In the year 1907 their number had increased somewhat and the people realized that proper regulations should be laid down governing their operation and some representation was made to the Government asking that this be done.

The agitation culminated in a large public meeting in the Market Hall in Charlottetown sometime in February or March 1908 which was attended by representative men from the country and city and the question was fully discussed from all standpoints, with the result that a resolution which asked for a proper Regulating Act was unanimously

carried. A few days afterward to the astonishment of the whole country the Government passed a Prohibitory Act which has given the Province fame of a doubtful nature throughout the whole civilized world.

The leading newspapers from the Atlantic to the Pacific, both in Canada and the United States, held us up to ridicule, papers in South America, in Australia, in Cape Town and all over Europe quietly poked fun at us or asked us what manner of people we were. Even the great London Times honored us with a half-column of its editorial space and condemned such a backward policy in no uncertain terms. In the four years that have elapsed since then we have suffered severely on account of this obnoxious law.

What Other People Are Doing About It—

In New Brunswick, a Province very much like our own, they have the most satisfactory motor regulation in act America.

Briefly this Act provides that each driver must have a license, the fee for which ranges from \$5 to \$25. The driver must stop his car or engine if the driver of the team holds up his hand. Proper speed limits in country,

villages, towns, rounding curves, crossing roads, bridges, etc., are regulated. A violation of these regulations incurs heavy penalties including suspension of license.

Last year 500 home owned and nearly as many foreign cars operated all over New Brunswick without an accident or complaint

What We Lose By Upholding The Act—

The pocket books of Provincial people has suffered to the extent of not less than \$250,000 a year by the decrease of tourist traffic.

We have also lost on the price of our horses because they have not been trained to meet and pass motor cars and are thus unfit for mainland markets.

We have suffered by not being permitted to make use of this modern convenience op-

erated by such cheap power and each year increase the possibility of our Island as a summer resort. Farmers have lost on this Act by having to put up with poor and abominable roads. Wherever you find a motor car you will find good roads.

We have lost on this Act because it prevents the operation of a factory for the manufacture of motor vehicles of all kinds. Factories like this are

now established in Nova Scotia and one is soon to be started in S. John, N. B. This means that many of our mechanics will go abroad because there is not enough work for them at home. A factory here would build up our home Province, provide work for the unemployed, increase our population, mean more money in circulation and add to the wealth of the Province.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.
Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
