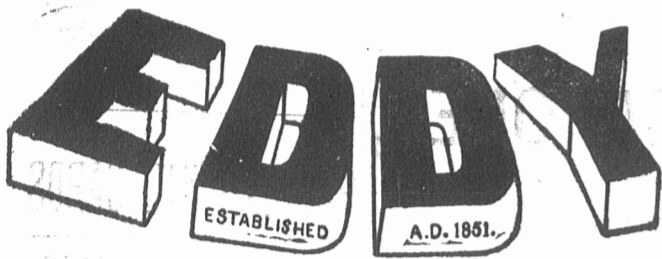

Archibald Geikie.
The newly-elected Secretary of the Royal Society, who takes Sir Michael Foster's place, is the best-known British and eminent European geologist. He is a fellow of the Royal Societies of London and Edinburgh, and a corresponding member of the Academies of Sciences of France, Germany, and of innumerable foreign Academies. He is the author of numerous geological memoirs in the publications of scientific societies, and his many works on geology began with "The Story of a Boulder," as long ago as 1858. Director-General of the Scottish Survey, the first occupant of many great chairs of geology, and director-general of the Geological Survey of the United Kingdom, and of the Geological Museum, there is hardly any honor which science in Sir Archibald Geikie's branch of it, has bestowed that he has not already received.

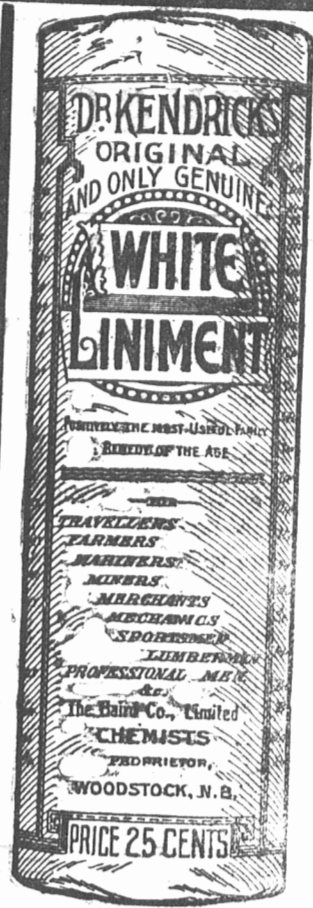
