asking them to allow autos to run in this country. They, those that want autos, say we are behind the times. Now in the first place Prince Edward Island cannot be compared to the rest of the Dominion. It is essentially an agricultural country. There are no industries like in other Provinces and no mines, etc. We have to depend chiefly on the farmers and where would P. E. I. be today if it was not for our farmers and our farmers' wives? Let the women have a vote on this momentous question and the majority of the women of both city and country will say let the auto stay where it is.

In the second place, how many people can afford an automobile? Not very many, and are those few going to rule our fair little island? A lot of people cannot afford to keep a good horse and rig let alone \$1,000 for an auto, besides the cost of running one. Not very long ago, there was a lot of news in the papers concerning mail order houses. The citizen of Charlottetown has said there would not be no Charlottetown if the people did not stop sending away their money. Mr. Editor, the greatest stimulus the mail order house ever got was when the auto was here. Women, the ones who do most of the shopping, as the shopkeeper is well aware, would not risk getting bones broken on the public highway and so sent money away instead of leaving it here, and today if the autos there will be fifty dollars for a mail order house where I am glad to say there is not five now.

Of course Charlottetown will be helped along some lines. They will want one more drug store, three more doctors and two more undertakers. The city merchant will therefore lose more than he will gain. Any correspondent writes that any fair lady can handle them. Let me ask him what is the matter when they lose control of the machine? Where is the fair lady then?—somewhere in the ditch, the river, or some other place, lone to death. Even the chauffeurs cannot guide them, and the people that are with him are killed, and that, often some innocent person. But they say this will not happen on Prince Edward Island. Let the autos return and the ones that have them will soon do the same as they do elsewhere. Restrictions and rules to not count with them.

SEC. KNOX GETS A HEARTY RECEPTION.

PANAMA, Feb. 28.—The newspapers here give great prominence to the visit of Secretary of State Knox, whom they welcome to Panama in the warmest terms. Many interviews with prominent men are published as to the effect of his visit.

For the second day of the visit a heavy program of entertainments and functions is provided. Early today the entertainment committee came to the hotel where Mr. Knox is staying and took the secretary and his party on a sight-seeing trip to the site of the original city of Panama.

On their return the party has been invited to lunch at the home of Maurice H. Thatcher, governor of the Panama canal zone. In the afternoon a reception is to be given by Rodolfo Chiari, the acting president, at the palace, and tonight a state dinner is to be given by Governor-General Paredes, at which Secretary of State Knox will make his first formal speech of the tour.

If the first day of his sojourn in Panama may be taken as a sample of what he is to expect, the secretary of state will be the busiest of men during the next few weeks. The brief periods between the various functions are occupied by him in receiving an endless stream of callers. Before he retired last night he had made half a dozen impromptu speeches.

Special precautions have been taken to guard the secretary of state during his visit, a large number of secret service men always being on duty in his immediate vicinity.

J. C. LITHGOW CHALLENGERS ON BEHALF OF MONCTON.

HALIFAX, March 1.—J. C. Lithgow, president of the Maritime Professional Hockey association, sent the following telegram last night to T. W. Foran, Ottawa, one of the trustees of the Stanley cup:

"On behalf of the Victoria hockey club of Moncton, N. B., winners of the Maritime Provincial Hockey league, I formally challenge, on their behalf for the Stanley cup, and ask you to arrange as early a date as possible. Please wire date for game and any additional information for formal challenge."

Mr. Lithgow sends the telegram in this form because he is not perfectly sure whether the challenge should go through the association or from the Moncton club direct.
