POINTS IN PREPARATION OF HOME-MADE VINEGAR

(Experimental Farm Note)

Vinegar as ordinarily produced is made from apple juice. It can, however, be made from many other sweet juices, from honey etc., provided the material used contains sufficient sugar and is in no way objectionable.

The production of vinegar is the result of two distinct fermentation processes, both depending on the action of micro-organisms. The first process consists in the changing of the sugar in the juice to alcohol and carbon dioxide, and is brought about by the action of yeasts. The second is brought about by the action of bacteria capable of acting on the alcohol and forming from it acetic acid which gives the vinegar its characteristic sour taste.

The time required for the fermentation will depend largely upon the temperature. The most favourable temperatures are 65-75 deg. F. under which conditions the alcoholic fermentation should be finished inside several days or a couple of weeks, as indicated by a cessation of "frothing." A frequent cause of failure is storage of the barrel at too low temperatures, which are unfavourable to the yeasts and permit other organisms of an undesirable type to flourish. Furthermore it is advisable to add a starter in the form of a yeast cake to every 4-5 gallons of juice.

The barrel should not be filled more than two-thirds full, and is best placed on its side, bunghole up, and open to allow the gas to escape. The opening should also be covered with a light cloth to keep out flies, dust, etc.

The acetic fermentation is best regulated by adding likewise a starter in the form of "mother of vinegar." This should never be added to the sweet cider but to the hard cider. Under the alcoholic fermentation, plenty of air is required for the acetic bacteria and it is advisable to ventilate the barrel by boring

openings in the end for better circulation of air. The same temperature should be maintained as for the alcoholic fermentation, and under such conditions, the vinegar should be ready in a few months. It may then be racked off carefully and stored in clean casks in a cool place after closing up to exclude air. Throughout the whole process of vinegar-making, cleanliness is extremely important to keep undesirable organisms from affecting the flavour and strength of the product.

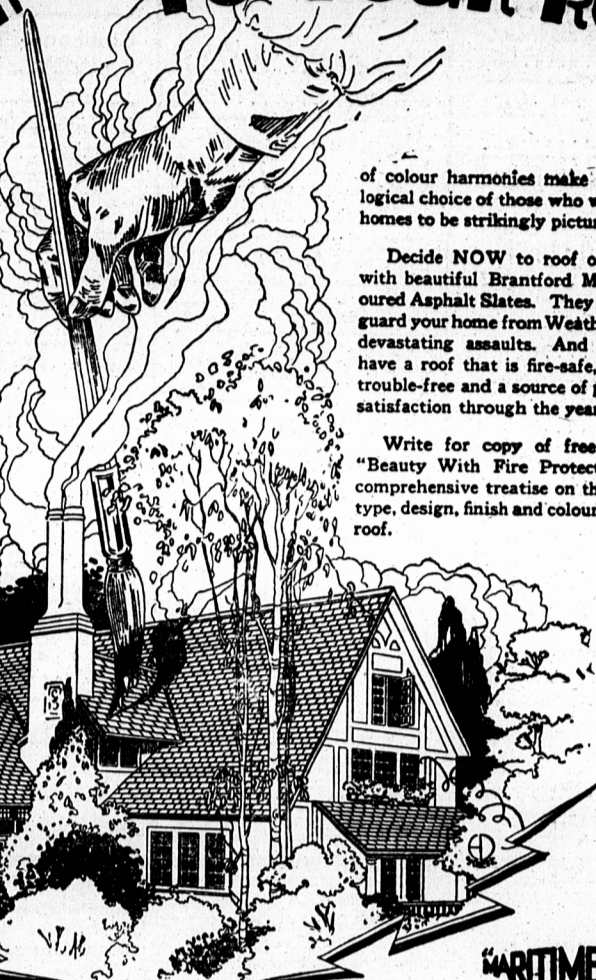
