CHERRY REFRIGERATOR CAKE

One tablespoon plain gelatine quarter cup cold water, one cup apricot juice, half cup sugar, quarter cup cherry juice, six table spoons lemon juice, 10 chopped cooked cherries, one cup coarsely cut apricots, 12 marshmallows, one cup heavy cream, one layer sponge cake.

PEACH SHORTCAKE

1-3 cup butter or shortening 3-4 cup sugar 3 egg yolks 1 egg white 2 cups sifted flour 3-1-2 teaspoons baking powder 1-2 teaspoon salt 3-4 cup milk 1-2 teaspoon vanilla 2 large peaches Sugar to taste

Method: Cream the butter and shortening and gradually cream in the sugar. Beat the egg yolks and the egg white together well and then add to the creamed mixture and beat until the mixture is light and fluffy.

PEACH FLUFF

1 peach, peeled and mashed 1 egg whites 1 cup sugar Method: Peel the peach and mash it fine. Combine with the egg whites and the sugar and beat the mixture until it becomes a creamy white in color and fairly stiff.

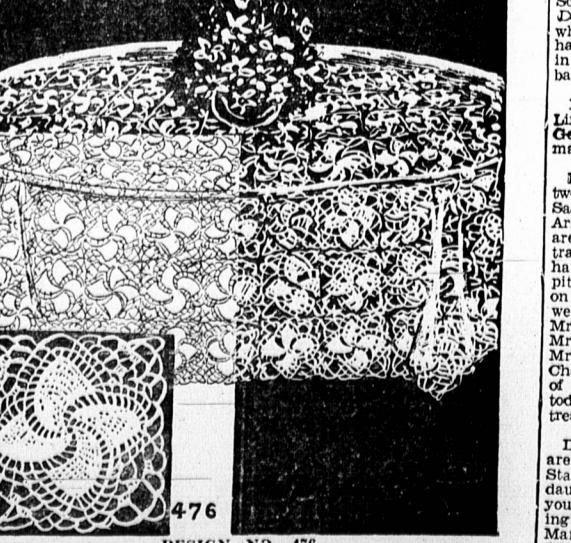
