Royal Wedding Plans Changed

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) SANDRINGHAM, England, Oct. 20—The wedding of the Duke of Gloucester to Lady Alice Montagu-Douglas-Scott on Nov. 6 has been transferred from Westminster Abbey to a chapel of Buckingham Palace because of the death of her father, it was announced officially tonight. The ceremony will be a private one in contrast to the magnificent public ceremony last November which united the Duke of Kent and Princess Marina of Greece. The Duke of Gloucester is the third son of Their Majesties. Lady Alice left London in the private plane of the Prince of Wales for the bedside of her father, the Duke of Buccleuch, who passed away at Selkirk, Scotland.



Scout News and Notices

Following an international Boy Scout camp fire at the Niagara Falls, Ont., Scout camp this summer, a party of Connecticut Scouts took home a Union Jack and the Canadian boys the Stars and Stripes.

How Swans spend the winter in Canada will be discovered by Moose Jaw Boy Scouts, who asked for and received from the parks board the task of looking after these regal favourites of the city park's bird life.

Boy Scout resourcefulness turns many strange structures into satisfactory meeting places. An ancient, retired C.N.R. box car, on a vacant lot, has made an ideal home, according to the boys of the 1st North Regina Troop. A fireplace will make it the coziest place in town, in the winter.

A miniature hurricane sweeping over the Ridgetown, Ont., fair grounds, unroofing buildings and levelling race track bleachers and racetracks, brought the Boy Scouts on duty an unexpected job. This was the administering of first aid to a considerable number of persons, several of them injured seriously.

Turning Boy Scout "adventure" into the real thing, three Philadelphia Scouts, Nature Directors of a large New Jersey permanent Scout camp, are planning to explore unknown areas of the 700 square mile Okefenokee swamp, on the Georgia-Florida border. The boys will seek specimens of rare fish and small mammals for the Academy of Natural Sciences.

The first conference of leaders of physically and mentally handicapped Wolf Cub and Boy Scout units in children's hospitals and sanitariums will be held at Queen Mary's Hospital, Carshalton, Surrey, in November. The remarkable success of Scout training for handicapped boys has caused a rapid development of this branch of the Scout Movement, notably throughout the British Empire.

A "Boy Scout Week," to advance Scouting in New South Wales, was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor Sir Alexander Hore-Ruthven.

Among those present at the recent world gathering of Rover Scouts in Sweden was a group of very smart and highly intelligent Ethiopian Rovers, according to one of the leaders of the Canadian contingent. There were no Italians.

According to Rabbi Louis Mann of Chicago, "It costs that city \$8 a year to maintain a Boy Scout, and \$500 to apprehend and confine a juvenile delinquent." The figures do not greatly differ in Canada.

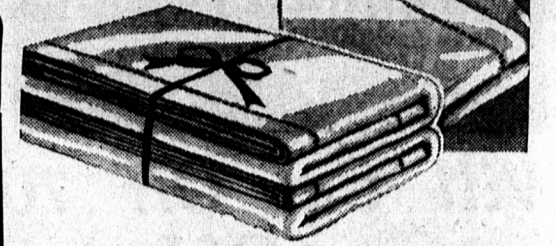
A silver-gilt push-button used by King George to light the Jubilee Scout Beacon in Hyde Park has been presented by His Majesty to Imperial Scout Headquarters. The stand bears the inscription: "Presented by King George V to the Boy Scouts to commemorate the lighting of the bonfire in Hyde Park on May 6th, 1935."

Scout's "Loch Ness monster" is to have no rest. Scientists, zoologists, fishermen and sailors having failed, Boy Scout are going to have a go at it. Under their Scoutmaster the boys of the 1st Glasgow Troop plan, with a fleet of row boats, to maintain a patrol of the lake until the mystery is solved.

The rare make-believe adventure of "riding pony express" in swift relays over mountain and desert trails, 1900 miles from Sacramento, California, to St. Joseph, Missouri, fell to the lot of 199 American Boy Scouts this summer. The revival of the historic mail route of '49 was a commemorative feature arranged by the Oregon Trail Memorial Association. With his bag of dispatches, each Scout rode, all out, for ten miles, keeping a sharp eye for Indians and stage-coach robbers. Unfortunately none were encountered and the trusty six-shooter was not drawn.
