Mr. Herman Cook and his grave charge ought not to drop out of sight simply because the elections are past. We still think that Mr. Cook ought not to have made the charge when he did without naming the persons directly implicated in making him the proposition which he alleges was made, but he may still supply that omission if he will. If he fails to do so the general public will think very lightly of both him and his charges.

Mr. H. V. Wiley, Chief of the Chemistry Division in the U. S. Department of Agriculture, in an article in the Forum, states that one of the most important exhibits at the Paris Exhibition, was a new method of making bread. The Schweitzer process, as it is called, covers both the process of milling and bread-making. It is partly based on the theory that by the present roller process of grinding a considerable part of the nutritive property of the wheat is lost; and also upon the fact that wheat flour rapidly deteriorates and loses flavor after being ground, as coffee does. The Schweitzer process includes a bakery attached to the flouring mills, so that the bread is always made from fresh ground flour. The bread thus made is described as having a yellowish tint which seems likely to prejudice the customer at first; but when once eaten it is found to be so palatable, aromatic and nutritious that no other is desired. The use of the new bread is rapidly spreading in Paris.

STATUE TO LORD STRATHCONA.

Lord Strathcona was the other day presented with a complimentary address in the Board of Trade building, Montreal, coupled with a request that he will consent to the erection of a public statue in his honor. The address recalls his great services to the Dominion, to the city of Montreal, to the cause of learning and philanthropy and to the Empire at large. His Lordship while modestly disclaiming the great merits and services attributed to him gave his consent to the statue, the erection of which will now go forward.

Many in all parts of the Dominion will be pleased to learn that it is proposed to Honor Lord Strathcona in this notable fashion while he still lives, all being sensible that he has well deserved the distinction. Men of all parties and creeds were represented at the meeting, and are upon the committee appointed to carry out the wishes there expressed. Very happy complimentary addresses were delivered by Senator Drummond, Hon. J. I. Tarte and others, including Rev. Dr. Barclay. Among other things Rev. Dr. Barclay said:

There was not a province from the Atlantic to the Pacific that had not seen and felt the wholesomeness of his life and the generosity of his heart. There was no department of life that did not own him as one of the best influences and powers to-day. Take what was represented at that gathering—commerce, industry, enterprise—and where in the wide Dominion would you find a better example or a more powerful advocate and promoter than Lord Strathcona. Take patriotism and our country claimed him as her noblest son. Take philanthropy, a most munificent benefactor. Take education, our wisest and most liberal patron. Take charity in all its institutions and all its efforts, her quickest sympathizer and her readiest supporter. Take the church and all its branches and one and all joined in this accord of praise. What could be said of a man who, almost without a hint erected and endowed a hospital, established schools and colleges and at a moment's notice when the occasion arose equipped an army. (Applause). There was not an office in the Dominion which Lord Strathcona could not have taken if he would take it; and there was not an office that he would not honor by the taking of it. (Renewed applause).
