

**Annual Convention of Christian Churches Held Here**

The annual convention of the Christian Churches of P. E. Island opened at Summerside on Saturday evening July 8th at 6.30 p.m. After a half hour's devotional service an address of welcome was given by Rev. Thos. H. Bates, pastor of the Christian Church in Summerside. A half hour was then taken up with a general social service, when the convention adjourned to meet on the following Sunday.

Sunday July 9th—Morning service was conducted in the Christian Church by Rev. Robert Pecrum M. A.; Charlottetown, while Rev. John Simpson and Rev. W. R. Motley M. A. occupied the pulpit in the Presbyterian and Baptist Churches respectively. At 12 p. m. the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed, Rev. Mr. Bates officiating.

The afternoon session opened at 3 p. m. Devotional exercises were led by Rev. Mr. Pecrum after which Rev. Mr. Motley entered the pulpit and preached very acceptably on the subject of Christian Union.

The evening session opened at 7.30 with devotional exercises led by Rev. Mr. Simpson. The pulpit was then occupied by Rev. Mr. Bates who delivered an eloquent sermon taking as his subject, "Christ the Head of the Church."

Monday July 10th. Regular business session opened at 10 a. m. Rev. Mr. Simpson was appointed Secretary pro tem. Minutes of last convention were read and approved.

The election of officers for the ensuing year was then held which resulted as follows:

 Treasurer—Franklin Boyer, Charlottetown.

After election of officers the next half hour was taken up with the appointment of committees, reports from the different churches and discussion of new business.

In the afternoon session an excellent paper was read by Rev. Mr. Pecrum on Home Missions—subject: The Field, the Work—Three Missionaries' Reward which evoked much discussion.

A motion was then made and carried unanimously that the Board of officers be empowered to place an evangelist in the field. An address was then given on "Foreign Missions by Rev. Mr. Pecrum following by a conference on Sunday School work led by Rev. Mr. Motley. Session closed with the benediction.

The last session of the convention opened at 7.30 p. m. Rev. Mr. Pecrum occupied the pulpit and preached an eloquent and thoughtful sermon on "The Christocentric Gospel."
