ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

The Budget speech will likely be delivered tonight, or tomorrow night.

G. R. LOCKHART, Manager of the Condensed Milk Factory has taken the residence of the late Dr. Shaw, corner of Prince and Kuston streets.

The funeral of the late John Beales will take place from the residence of Wm Gillespie Upper Queen Street on Thursday at 1.30 to Railway Station thence to Snerwood Cemetery.

The Princess left early yesterday morning for Picton and reached that port at twelve o'clock. She encountered heavy fog and considerable fog. She will leave on return this morning.

It is understood that the St. John parties who have been contemplating the purchase of the Hotel Davies have decided to take no action in the matter for the present. It is thus probable that the Hotel will not be opened for some time.

The Elfin made the first two trips of the season to Rocky Point yesterday. Till the Hillsboro is ready early next week for Southport ferry the Elfin will make one trip in the morning and one in the afternoon each day, to Rocky Point. Captain Wsner is determined to make this ferry the coming season even more popular than in the past.

An early start to the Opera House will be in order for those who want a seat in the few regular admission tickets for "Princess Bonnie" opera to-morrow night. Notwithstanding the rainy day quite an inroad was made on the remaining seats on the plan and last night only about fifteen seats remained at the Medical Hall and a few more at Rankin's Summerside is sending a contingent of Scots of England and their friends by special train who have secured forty seats in the balcony. The Minto leaves this morning at seven for Picton and the Stanley at the same hour for Charlottetown. For the remainder of their trips to St. John's spring they will run together on this route, one leaving on return this morning.

The passengers by the steamer Bruce to North Sydney on Monday included Captain McMillan and eleven of the crew of the S. S. Elliott recently wrecked at St. Paul's Island who were taken to St. John's by the sailing steamer Aurora. They are expected home today or tomorrow.

Among the passengers by the Minto to Charlottetown yesterday were H. W. Bennett, St. John to relieve R. V. Longworth of the Bank of N. S., who is granted prolonged leave of absence; Peter McFarlane, Dominion Superintendent of But Freezers; and John T. McLean and Joseph Clark of the Elliott.

At a congregational meeting of the Baptists' Church last night Rev. G. R. White presented his report on the building of the parsonage in the rear of the church. It was decided to proceed with its erection and A. W. Sterns, Donald Nicholson, H. Jenkins, G. B. Norton, G. A. W. Robertson, and Rev. G. R. White appointed a building committee.

The death took place yesterday afternoon after a prolonged illness of David J. Dalling, son of James Dalling in the Department of Registrar of Deeds. The deceased who was twenty-two years of age was an estimable young man, much thought of by all his acquaintances. For a number of years he was in the employ of the P. E. I. Telephone Co., and was also a member of Lodge Prince Edward, S. O. E. The bereaved parents will have the sympathy of many friends.

The trial of Cyrus L. Ryan of Charlottetown, for the alleged murder of Quong Sing, a Chinese laundryman of Hanover Four Corners, will probably be held early next month before the Plymouth county superior court at Plymouth. It is understood that Ryan will make a strong defence. Some of the witnesses are expected to be Miss Catherine Murray, formerly of Prince Edward Island, and other provincialists. Ryan was formerly a kitchen hand on the steamer Olivette, which ran between Boston, Halifax and Charlottetown.

McLean, Esq. is to be the scene of an interesting ceremony at 2 o'clock this afternoon when his eldest daughter, Miss Emily Mary is to be united in marriage to Charles Pummer Hill, a prominent mining engineer and dealer in real estate in Manitoba and the west. The ceremony is to be performed by Rev. T. F. Fuller in the presence of a number of invited guests. The parlor is artistically decorated for the occasion with foliage and flowers. A large number of beautiful presents have been received. At the conclusion of the ceremony the bridal party intend to leave at 3.40 by special train for Summerside where they will luncheon, returning during the night and leaving Thursday morning by the Stanley en route to Winnipeg. 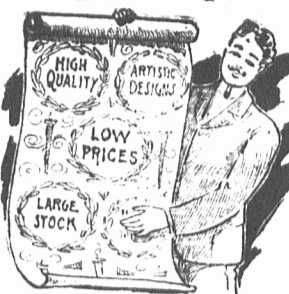
