PROTEST AGAINST TAX PAYMENT

Suffragist Duchess Shows Hostility to Taxation of Women.

LONDON, April 24 (Special)—Distraint has been levied upon Duchess Adeline of Bedford for non-payment of her taxes. A silver cup was taken to satisfy the claims of the tax collector.

The Duchess is an ardent suffragist, and she took this means of showing her hostility to the taxation of women while they are still without the franchise.

"Arson squads" of militant suffragettes burned a hay rick in Wiltshire belonging to the father of Mr. Charles Hobhouse, the Chancellor of the Duchess of Lancaster, while the grand stand at the Ilford football ground was also set on fire by them but the flames were quenched by a watchman before they had obtained a hold.

The bill aimed at hunger strikes by militant suffragettes introduced in the House of Commons on March 26 by the Home Secretary, Mr. Reginald McKenna, came up for discussion in the House Monday. Mr. McKenna appealed for urgent action because, pending the passage of the bill, he felt it his duty to continue forcible feeding, which he was desirous of avoiding. At the same time he refused to accept an amendment having the effect of prohibiting forcible feeding, for the reason that he wished to retain this power to resort to this method when, in his opinion, the release of a hunger striker might endanger public interests.

The bill, which was passed through committee unamended, provides for the temporary conditional discharge of prisoners whose detention is undesirable on account of their condition of health. Prisoners discharged in this way would have to return to prison on the expiration of the period stated in their order of release, or would be liable to arrest without warrant.

PETER THE GREAT GUIDES RUSSIA

The Will of the Czar Who Died in 1725 is Believed to be a Living Influence

For nearly two centuries Russia's political activity has been guided by a program formulated by Peter the Great. When he died in 1725 the great emperor made a prophecy that some day Russia would rule the world, and in his secret will he traced the steps the future czars must travel to accomplish that end. In the years since Peter's death many of his prophecies have come true. He said in his will:

"We must progress as much as possible in the direction of Constantinople and India. He who can once get possession of those points is the real ruler of the world. With that view we must provoke constant quarrels at one time with Turkey and at another with Persia. Moreover, we must take pains to establish and maintain an intimate union with Austria, apparently consenting to its schemes for future aggrandisement and all the while secretly rousing the jealousy of the minor states against it. In this way we must bring it to pass that one or the other party shall seek aid from Russia and thus we shall exercise a sort of protectorate over the country which will pave the way for future supremacy."

No diplomat of to-day could summarize Russia's activity in the Balkan war more clearly. Serbia, Montenegro and Bulgaria are jealous of Austria's creeping policy, and have turned to Russia for support. That is the protectorate. And as for future supremacy! Poland once turned to Russia as the Balkan States do to-day.

To Eliminate Austria

Peter the Great's dream was to make Russia mistress of the world. His entire plan worked to that end. First, he said, Russia must get Finland, Poland, the Baltic Sea and the Black Sea. Those conquests are a matter of history. Then India and Persia were slated for overthrow. Russia has spread across the Caspian Sea, made Turkistan a subsidiary province and only last year went into Northern Persia. Only Afghanistan remains between Russia and India. Russian princes have taken German princesses as their consorts. Peter the Great counseled. Then he comes back to Constantinople. "We must make the house of Austria interested in the expulsion of the Turks from Europe, and we must neutralize its jealousy at the capture of Constantinople either by preoccupying it with a war with the old European states, or by allowing it a share of the spoil, which we can afterward resume at our leisure."

A Good Dreamer

How nearly that dream materialized makes one of the most interesting chapters of Napoleon's life. The French Emperor and Czar Alexander I. met on a raft in the middle of the Memel River at Tilsit and drew up plans to divide the world. Austria was then a cat's paw for Napoleon through his marriage with the arch-duchess, Marie Louise. But England was too strong on the sea and Napoleon began to play Russia false so Alexander broke his pact with the French Emperor.

Peter believed the future supremacy of Russia was ordered by providence. He saw the star of empire working its way north—Egypt, Chaldea, Babylon, Greece, Rome, France, England and then the hordes from Russia and northern Asia. He said:

"I look on the future invasion of the eastern and western countries by the north as a peremptory command ordained by providence, who in like manner regenerated the Roman nation by barbarian invasions. These migrations of men from the north are as the flow of the Nile, which at certain periods comes to fertilize the impoverished lands of Egypt by its deposit. I found Russia as a rivulet. I leave it a river. My successors will make of it a large sea, destined to fertilize the impoverished lands of Europe, and its waters will overflow in spite of opposing dams erected by weak hands. If our descendants only know how to direct its course. I give these countries to their watchfulness and care, as Moses gave the Tables of the Law to the Jewish people."

Tragedy of Snoring

John Westnutt, aged sixty-seven, an inmate of Caxton Workhouse, was found guilty at Cambridge Assizes of the manslaughter of John Knight, an other aged inmate. Knight snored during the night, and Westnutt, greatly annoyed, struck him on the knee with a belt. Medical evidence showed that death resulted from septic absorption. The wound was not serious, and probably would not have been fatal had not Knight been a man of weak intellect and low vitality. Westnutt, who had been in custody for two days' imprisonment.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres wholly owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$200 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the home stead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his pre-emptive right and cannot obtain pre-emptive may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres ad erect a house worth \$3000.
