NAVY BILL OF NEW ZEALAND

LONDON, Oct. 29. (Special)—A naval bill will be introduced in the New Zealand Parliament this week, and it is expected that the proposals will embrace the establishment of a local squadron some time in the future, but with contributions to the Admiralty for the maintenance of a class of small warships to continue in the meantime. A system of training for men of the fleet will also be provided.

CREW HAD CLOSE CALL FOR LIVES.

BOSTON, Oct. 27.—Five men and a woman who barely had time to save themselves before the schooner Henry P. Havens, of Duckport, Maine, sank off Highland Light yesterday, safely pushed through the breakers and landed on Point Allerton beach at Hull.

The Havens, bound from New York for Bangor, coal laden, was caught in a heavy gale 35 miles off Highland Light, and all three masts went over board. The crew hastily lowered a boat and jumped in. Captain Ernest Ray and his wife followed, Mrs. Ray refusing to enter the boat until after her husband had left the schooner. A long pull through heavy seas brought the boat to shore. The Havens was built at Newburgh, N. Y., in 1882, and registered 300 tons.

CHINA'S POLITICS RUINOUS TO HER

PEKIN, Oct. 29. (Special)—It is regrettable to have to record that the government of China has allowed politics to interfere so seriously with the arrangements being made to provide suitable exhibits for the Panama Canal that the products and curiosities of China are not likely to receive the representation they deserve.

When the request came to the government to participate in the great exposition it was gladly responded to, and Mr. Liu Kwei-Yi, then Minister for Agriculture and Commerce, under whose department the matter was placed, entered into the work of preparation with enthusiasm.

Mr. Chen Chi was appointed Commissioner on account of his previous experience as head of the Nanking Exposition, and the Cabinet fell in with the proposal of Mr. Liu to provide \$1,500,000 to defray the expenses connected with the collection and installation of the exhibit. Offices were taken, a staff was got together and conferences ultimately evolved a scheme which would have assured China a representation at San Francisco second to none for utility, uniqueness and attractiveness.

Then the impetuosity of China caused the Minister of Agriculture to fall. He was tempted to negotiate a loan with a foreigner. His enemies questioned the validity of the agreement, challenged the right of the Minister to sign a preliminary agreement without reference to Parliament, declared the use of the seal of the Ministry to have been contrary to law, and generally raised such a hubbub in and out of Parliament that the Minister was compelled to go before Parliament to explain his connections with the matter. Unhappily he was unable to satisfy the hostile members, and the result was that he had to resign his office.

STRIKERS' BATTLE TO SAVE HOMES.

TRINIDAD, Colo., October 27.—Strikers captured seven guards today at Chicoa Junction, eight miles north of Trinidad. It was also reported that they captured a Colorado and South-eastern engine.

For half an hour today more than 125 strikers battled at a mile range with several steel carloads of mine guards who were travelling over the Colorado and Southern railroad track ostensibly on their way to the Hastings mine. The strikers at the Ludlow camp have been led to the belief that the guards were entraining to attack the tent colony and consequently set about to defend their temporary homes.

Train derailleurs were set upon the track, the switches were thrown whenever possible, and a number of strikers armed with power rifles entrenched themselves, at a point a mile and a half from the tent colony adjacent to the railroad. When the train first came into sight a mile away the strikers began firing. The engineer stopped the train immediately and the guards returned the fire. After half an hour's fighting three guards are reported to have been slightly wounded, the train was backed down the track, and the strikers returned to their colony.

DISCUSSED AT WAR OFFICE.

OTTAWA, October 28.—A number of important details of military conduct are understood to have been under discussion between the Canadian military authorities and the British War Office and are likely to be put into effect in the near future. They include the "adjustment" of the pensions to be paid by Canada for British officers serving here. It is understood that Canada will pay its fair share for the time Old Country Officers are in this country. Then it is proposed that in future examinations of Canadian officers, tactical schemes will be laid on Canadian maps rather than on those whereon the names are not familiar. Another plan is to have representatives of the colonies interested on all boards for the examination of officers. The extension of the interchange of officers to active command of units in camp is also under consideration.
