Art Centre & Museum Is Guild's Objective

The P.E.I. Arts and Crafts Guild has taken the first step toward raising money for an art centre and museum in Charlottetown by asking its members to consider ways of raising funds for this purpose, and also by initiating the practice of making a small charge for all its children's and adult classes. Up to this time they have been offered free. The charge is being made small enough that it should discourage no one from attending the classes, and indeed is so small that it can't possibly amount to very much of the total needed, according to Miss Frances Johnston, the Guild's director. She does feel, however, that it is one way to have a large number of persons contributing toward an art centre and museum, and should encourage more people to become actively interested in the project. An act incorporating the Prince Edward Island Arts and Crafts Guild was passed in the Legislature early this spring and not many persons know that among the purposes which appear in the Guild's constitution is one which states that the Guild plans to collect and preserve the objects and records exemplifying and pertaining to the culture and history of the people of Prince Edward Island. The Guild, however, cannot establish its museum activities until it has the facilities for doing so. Its Art Centre program of children's classes, adult classes, art exhibitions, film showings and recorded concerts has been presented in two rooms in the Market Building which are shared with the I.O.D.E. Though it has been operating for only a little more than a year and a half, some 4000 gatherings for children and adults have been held in the Art Centre, and a total of over 10,000 people has participated in its program. This is a remarkable achievement, and the Guild's executive believe that it clearly illustrates the interest and need for a proper place to house its activities.



Scout News and Notices

B. H. Mortlock, Executive Commissioner for Publications at Canadian Boy Scout Headquarters, Ottawa, is making a tour of Western Canadian Boy Scout centres, travelling by air for most of the trip. The next World Boy Scout Jamboree will be held at Salskammergut, Austria, in the summer of 1951. It was decided at the Twelfth Biennial International Scout Conference held recently in Elvesseter, Norway. It was agreed that the number of Scouts attending the Jamboree will be limited to 10,000. Two Vancouver Boy Scout Troops have recently returned from an Alpine Camp in the Black Tusk Meadows, Garibaldi Park, which is located in the mountain ranges north of Vancouver. The advance party flew in supplies by a chartered plane which landed on Garibaldi Lake. The main party reached the camp via steamship, railway and by hiking. Four mountain peaks were climbed by the Scout campers. Jackson Dodds, C. B. E., Montreal Dominion Commissioner of Canada's Boy Scouts, who has been a member of the International Scout Committee for the past two years, was appointed a member of the Finance Committee of the International Bureau, at the recent meeting of the Committee in Norway which Mr. Dodds attended. Maj.-Gen. D. C. Spry, C. B. E., D.S.O., Chief Executive Commissioner of Canada's Boy Scouts, also attended the International Scout Committee meeting in Norway and was appointed a member of the International Committee for six years. Calgary, Alberta, will be the scene of a meeting of the Dominion Executive Committee of the Canadian General Council, the Boy Scouts Association, on October 14th.
