The Halifax Herald Will Pay the Expenses.

In July, or as soon thereafter as restrictions against touring are removed, The Halifax Herald proposes sending seven women of Nova Scotia, Westmoreland county, N. B., Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland on a FIFTY DAY tour of the battlefields of France and Belgium. The party will spend one week in London, the metropolis of the world, one week in Paris, the gayest city in the world, ten days going over the particular sections of the battlefields of France and Belgium where the Canadian boys from P. E. I. Nova Scotia N. B. and Newfoundland fought, bled and died in order that the world might be made safe against the aggressions of the despicable Huns and the balance of the time will be spent touring in other cities of France, Belgium and Switzerland and on ocean.

Vimy Ridge—"Vimy"—the very name of that historic battle scene must act like a wizard's wand on the imagination of our people, whose fighting lads, in wrestling this mighty stronghold from the Huns achieved one of the most glorious feats of arms in the European war. Who that could afford it would not gladly go to stand on Hill 145, and view with pride the scene of the mighty conflict, gaze reverently on the white crosses, row on row, and the sculptured monuments of those who fell of that field of honor. The Halifax Herald's Battlefield trip will make a longed-for experience possible—at no cost to the fortunate visitors.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Parties by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency or certain conditions.

Duration—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$10 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony and. Live stock may be authorized for cultivation under certain conditions.
