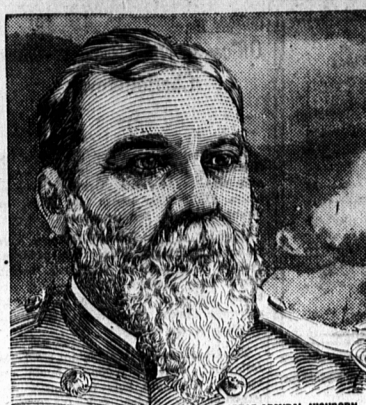
Kinkora 2.20 has changed hands. W. B. Bowness has added him to his stable where he will have lots of fast company.

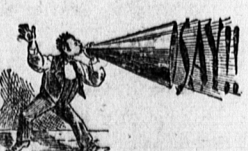
