Philippines May Be Used As a Bait

New Scheme to Settle United States Japanese Question Gaining Ground --A Partial Annexation--Mikado's Kingdom to Have Full Trade.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 8.—The possibility of the settlement of the differences between the United States and Japan on a basis never heretofore publicly suggested, is said to be imminent. A scheme in which the Philippines is involved is said on high authority to have the endorsement of Baron Kaneko, probably as close a student of the relations between the United States and Japan as any man in either country, and the belligerent is entertained in well-informed circles that if the Japanese ambassador, Takahira, comes there will be negotiations along the line of the new proposal. Briefly, the new proposal amounts to a sort of commercial annexation of the Philippines by Japan, without any political annexation. It is said this has been considered favorably by a few statesmen in both countries, and is regarded as worth a serious discussion. The scheme is based on a frank recognition of the fact that two alien races ought not to be unnecessarily brought into competition. The objection to the competition with the Filipinos makes free trade between the United States and the islands impossible. Likewise, the objection of American labor has caused the trouble about Japanese immigration. So it is proposed to make a treaty under which Japan and the Philippines will admit each other's products free. The Japanese will furnish an outlet for the Filipino produce under this free trade arrangement which the United States has been unwilling to grant. Japan will get the benefit of the Philippine trade, and the United States will be saved Philippine competition, and all three parties will be benefited.

150,000 MAY BE THROWN OUT OF WORK

MANCHESTER, January 8.—Unless the spinners modify their demands, the cotton mills throughout the country, owned by 500 members of the Federation of Master Spinners, will be closed and 150,000 employes will be locked out. Already firms owing 96 per cent of the spindles have announced their willingness to close their mills, and the federation has sent out notices calling upon all firms to notify their employes that work will cease on January 25 if the demands, which involve an increase in wages, are persisted in. The firms will not be allowed to continue to work under a penalty payment system, as permitted on previous occasions, so that the lockout will be completed.

REFORMATION OF TORONTO'S INEBRIATES

The Creditable Work That Has Been Accomplished By Ontario Society

TORONTO, Jan. 8.—At the quarterly meeting of the executive committee of the Ontario Society for the Reformation of Inebriates, Prof. G. M. Wrong, the president in the chair, the following statistics for 11 months of 1907 were presented by Dr. R. S. Briggs, the secretary:

There were 49 inebriates under treatment of these 36 belonged to Toronto; 15 were married and 23 single; 33 received hospital treatment and 5 received home treatment; 32 were police court cases; work was found for 11, and 9 were brought in touch with the church of their choice. Temporary treatment was given to 80 prisoners the day of discharge, and conversation was held by the probation officer with over 40 in the police cells before the opening of the court.

The result of treatment for the 11 months is as follows: Doing well, 10; improved, 15; unknown 5; not improved (only temporary), 10.

The total number treated up to Nov. 30, is 64, and the result is as follows: Doing well, 16; improved, 21; unknown, 10; improvement temporary, 17. Total, 64.

Of these 64, three repaid the total cost of treatment and 7 paid in part.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 24, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section (60 a. more or less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land office or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans.

- (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
- (2) A homesteader may, if he so desire perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. If the father is deceased of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with a father, or mother.
- (3) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than one mile in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.
- (4) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with his father or on farming land owned by himself must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
- (5) Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at the place of intention to apply for a patent.
