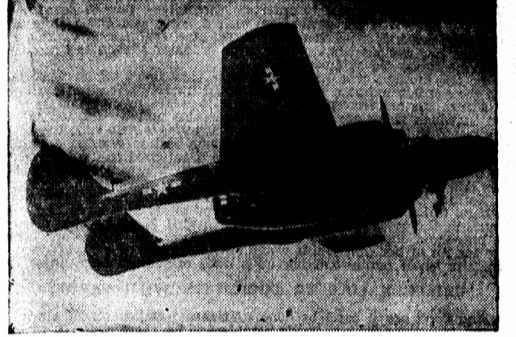

U. S. TROOPS 6 MILES FROM CHERBOURG

300 Jap Planes Downed In Battle Advance Ten Miles During Yesterday

U. S. Troops Take Airfield On Saipan Is.

PEARL HARBOR, June 19 (AP)—United States Marines and army troops have captured Asitolo airfield and driven eastward all the way across Saipan Island to the shore of Magicienne Bay, while an estimated 300 Japanese planes attacking the offshore American carrier task force were destroyed in the greatest air battle since Midway. It was announced today.

Robot Planes Jet Propelled

LONDON, June 19 (CP-Reuters)—German pilotless planes attacking Britain yesterday were jet-propelled, it was stated officially here today.

WITH U.S. FORCES IN NORMANDY, June 19—(CP-Reuters)—Field Headquarters announced today that the German forces trapped in the centre sector of the Normandy Peninsula have begun a general retreat toward the port of Cherbourg.

On the verge of their biggest triumph to date in the invasion of Normandy, the American forces in the Cherbourg Peninsula had practically reached a row of hills six miles south of Cherbourg.

1,900 GERMANS CAPTURED

Front dispatches said the troops pushing up from the south had captured more than 1,900 Germans during the day and were over-running the few machine-gun posts and sniper nests forming rearguards for the Nazis fleeing into the hills.

50,000 TRAPPED?

Wheeling northward from St. Jacques De Nehou and Barneville near the west coast, the Americans in an overall gain of 10 miles rolled through Bricquebec, an important highway town 11 miles south of Cherbourg, and hurled the Germans three miles beyond the city.

OTTAWA, June 19 (CP)—Sgt. Brian O'Leary, son of Grattan O'Leary of the Ottawa Journal, is reported a prisoner of war by the International Red Cross. It was learned today that O'Leary, a member of the R.C.A.F., previously was reported missing.
